

Dick Attlesey Cracks World Hurdle Mark

HELSINKI, Finland, July 10 (AP)—Dick Attlesey of Southern California cracked the world record for the 110-meter high hurdles tonight with a time of 13.5s.

The 6-foot 4-inch athlete bettered the world mark by two-tenths of a second. It is held jointly by Fred Wolcott of Rice and Spec Towns of Georgia.

Attlesey also bettered the world record in the 120-yard high hurdles earlier this year at Fresno with a clocking of 13.5s. Harrison Dillard of Baldwin-Wallace holds that mark at 13.6s.

Yanks Triumph

A crowd of 7000 saw the lanky Californian lead a touring American track squad to victory in five of six events they entered.

George Rhoden, the Jamaican who runs for little Morgan State College of Baltimore, also burned up the track. He sped the 400 meters in 46.5s.

It is the third time this year Attlesey has surpassed world high hurdle marks. He first bettered the 110-meter record in the National AAU meet with 13.6s. at College Park, Md., last month.

The United States team competed against Finns and Britons in an international meet.

An old Finnish mile record set by peerless Paavo Nurmi more than 20 years ago fell also. I. Taipale of Finland ran the distance in 4m. 9.4s., exactly one second better than the great Nurmi's mark. Fred Wilt of the New York AC finished far back in 4m. 15s.

Richards Wins

Rev. Bob Richards of the Illinois AC won the pole vault at 14ft. 7in. Bob Smith of San Diego State placed third with 13ft. 5 4-5in.

John Twomey of the Illinois AC crossed the finish line in the 3000-meter run far ahead of Fin-

nish competition. His time was 8m. 37.2s.

Dick Doyle of Montana hurled the discus 168ft. 7½in. His winning performance is the best he's done on the tour.

An Englishman, Roger Bannister, won the 800-meter run in 1m. 53.5s. N. Stacey, a teammate, captured the 200-meter dash in 21.7s. No Americans competed in these two events.
