

Troy Wins; McEwen in Fancy Double

Don Laz, a handsome, poised youngster from West Aurora, Ill., wrote a new entry in the book of pole vaulting history yesterday.

Before 30,000 Coliseum fans who stayed long after the regulation meet had ended with a sweeping Southern California victory, the University of Illinois senior cleared 15 ft. 1½ in.

Thus, the first of the great Cornelius Warmerdam's outdoor vaulting records was shattered as Laz moved into the throne room with the Flying Dutchman in this most spectacular of all track and field events. It was Warmerdam's 15 ft. 7½ in. record that tumbled.

Track Fidelity

And Laz became the American inter-collegiate record holder in one of those cross-country oddities of the sport. A few hours earlier Don Cooper of Nebraska had vaulted 15 ft. 9 in. at the Kansas Relays, this achievement wrecking the 14-year-old college mark of 14 ft. 11 in. set by SC's "heavenly twins," Bill Sefton and Earle Meadows, at the Coliseum.

Only Warmerdam has vaulted higher outdoors than did Laz yesterday. The Dutchman's world record is 15 ft. 7¾ in.

The meet itself found the Trojans coming within a single point of equalling the combined total of its foes. SC scored 75 points to 41 for Illinois and 36 for Michigan. It was the outdoor debut for the Big Ten teams.

Great Double

Overshadowed by the magnitude of Laz's great achievement but nevertheless a notable performance was Don McEwen's double of 4 m. 11.36, and 5 m. 18.66, for Michigan, believed to be the furthest-mile-and-two-mile combination ever run in the Coliseum. He did them easily, with margins of 40 and 75 yards, respectively, the chief surprise coming with the seconds taken by Trojans in each case.

Art Garcia, 4 m. 19.46, beat the other Big Tennes in the mile and Gray Berg did the same in the eight-lapper, 5 m. 28.36. Jim (Chief) Kinnear of SC was last in the mile and dropped out of the two-mile on the seventh lap.

O'Brien Sets Mark

McEwen's mile was a new Michigan record.

Perry O'Brien, SC's sophomore, hoisted his school's shot-put standard a full foot with a 60 ft.-4½ in. heave on his second try. His first attempt, a foul, went even farther. Earl Audet, 1944, was the record holder.

The meet found the Trojans picking up unexpected points on every hand, an SC man getting at least second in every event. The visitors showed their complete lack of outdoor training.

Don Soars Over

Laz had missed one try at 14 ft. 8 in. but he soared over 14 ft. 8 in. and then the bar went to 15 ft. 2 in. The official measurement by AAU official Larry Houston later showed it to be 15 ft. 1½ in.

Don missed the first try badly.
