

Trojans Near 19th Fresno Relays Crown

Chandler, Oxy Relay Quartet Crack Meet Records in Classic

FRESNO, May 12—Southern California was well on its way to earning a 19th team victory in 25 years of West Coast Relays competition here tonight as the Trojans piled up 61 points in the first 11 events.

Meet records fell in open shot put, distance medley relay and 5000-meter run.

Trojans Score

The Trojans scored their first victory in the four-man 880 relay, an event in which they beat the favored Bruins of UCLA by three yards in 1m. 25.5s.

Occidental's bid for a national mark in the distance medley relay came a cropper although the Tigers did clip the meet record by a substantial margin.

The Tigers triumphed in 10m. .6s. compared to a national mark of 9m. 59.4s. and a meet listing of 10m. 3.3s.

McKibben Sizzles

Walt McKibben sprinted a 440 in 47s. flat, Hal Butler followed with a 1m. 57s. 880, John Barnes did the 1320 in 3m. 5.1s. and Bob McMillen closed with a 4m. 11.5s. mile. SC's Art Garcia beat Barnes by six yards on their leg of the race, giving Jim (Chief) Newcomb a yard lead on McMillen. But the Glendale boy finished the race with a 70-yard margin on his Trojan foe. Both Butler and Barnes have run their distances in much swifter times this year.

Dick Attlessey, who took his heat in 13.9s. during a windy afternoon program, captured the 120 high hurdles in 13.7s. at night. This is the best mark in the world this year and is only two-tenths of a second off the LAAC stylist's world mark set here a year ago. A 4.6 m.p.h. wind aided the hurdlers.

nard by four yards. Jack Davis of SC was another yard back and Craig Dixon of LAAC placed fourth.

Richard Rockets

Rod Richard, UCLA's sophomore sprinter who was a Class B runner at LA Poly High, upset teammate Bobby Work for the first time this year in taking the open 100 in 9.5s.

Richard, who had been robbed of a heat victory in the afternoon, made it convincing tonight. His margin over Work was a full yard with the aiding wind only 3.5 m.p.h., an allowable margin for record acceptance. His mark is a new Bruin school mark.

Two meet marks crashed during early evening events.

Otis Chandler, ex-Stanford man now competing for the Olympic club, did 56ft. 1½ in. on his first throw, raising the open division mark by nearly a foot. SC's Parry O'Brien was second at 53ft. 6¾ in.
