## **Attlesey** Skips Hurdles in 13.6s.

MODESTO, May 19 (AP)-World Record Holder Dick Attlesey of the Los Angeles Athletic Club won the open 120vard high hurdles in the California Relays tonight in 13.6s.

It was one-tenth of a second slower than the world standard he set last year at Fresno, while representing Southern California. But it established a new relavs mark.

## **Bests Heat Mark**

Attlesey won his heat in the preliminaries in 13.8s, to break the mark of 13.9s, set by Craig Dixon of UCLA in 1949.

Long-legged Attlesev proved he is still the hurdling kingpin of the United States if not the world. Last night in the Coliseum Relays in Los Angeles he won in 13.6s.

Tonight Attlesey overtook Dixon, his LAAC teammate, at

about the three-quarter mark after Dixon got off to a fast start.

Big Dick Doyle, representing the Montana AC of Missoula, won the discus throw at 165ft. 10¼ in. Olympic and American Decathlan Champion Bob Mathias of Stanford was second with 162ft, 10¼ in.

## **Hurdle Record Missed**

The Los Angeles Athletic Club team won the special 480-yard shuttle hurdle relay in 58.7s. The record for the event is 58.6s., recorded in 1940 by the University of Texas.

Dixon, Floyd Simmons, Don Halderman and Attlesev ran in that order for the LAAC.
