

# McMillen Wins Mile in 4m. 9s.

## Holmberg Second, Slykhuis Third to Occidental Ace

Bob McMillen, a black-haired junior from Occidental College, whipped the great Willy Slykhuis of Holland in the mile run of the Compton Invitational last night in 4m. 9s., equaling the best achievement by an American this year.

McMillen's stunning and emphatic victory highlighted the track and field program which drew 7500 fans to the Compton College Stadium and included these features:

Disqualification of Oxy's John Barnes after winning the 880 in 1m. 50.1s.

Four meet records shattered and another equaled, Barnes'

half-mile mark, if allowed, would have been a fifth new standard.

Best ever performances by UCLA's George Brown in the broad jump, LAAC's Dick Attlessey in the low hurdles and Oxy's Walt McKibben in the 220.

#### Stanfield Hurt

And the injury to Andy Stanfield, Seton Hall's great sprinter who pulled up lame at the 75-yard mark of the 100-yard dash.

McMillen whipped Slykhuis by five yards and another man also beat the Hollander, Alf Holmberg of Sweden and Tennessee, who was second only a yard behind McMillen.

Lap times were 58.5s., 62.4s., 64.7s. and 63.4s. McMillen set the pace the first two laps with Holmberg second and Slykhuis third. The Swede took over for the third lap, McMillen regained the lead going into the first turn of the last lap, Holmberg went in front again on the backstretch and then McMillen forged ahead coming into the home straightaway.

McMillen, whose time has only been equaled by Don McEwen of Michigan, was voted top athlete of the meet.

#### Track Record

Barnes was passing the pace-setting Mal Whitfield on the backstretch of the second lap in the controversial 880 when he brushed against the Olympic Games champ. Chief Inspector Percy Niersbach ruled Barnes

had interfered with Whitfield and the Oxy boy was thrown clear out of the placing.

At the tape Barnes had 10 yards on Bob Chambers, who also passed Whitfield, and Whitfield was another two yards back. Chambers' unofficial time was 1m. 51.2s.

Dick Attlessey, who tied the meet high hurdle mark of 13.7s., took .1s. off Craig Dixon's meet low hurdle standard with 22.9s. for the only track record.

In the field events there was a bevy of records-clobbering.

## Seymour Upset

George Brown of UCLA, with three leaps over 25 feet, had the most sensational evening with a winning jump of 25ft. 9in., which betters his own UCLA school mark, the district AAU standard, and the meet record by more than foot.

Bill Miller of Arizona State upset Dr. Steve Seymour and Cy Young with a 228ft. 8 1/2 in. javelin heave and Jim Fuchs' second toss in the shot went 57ft. 9 1/2 in., both meet records.

Stanfield, who was injured last year and missed the NCAA meet, reported the muscle twinge he felt last night was in the other leg. He was leading the 100 when he started easing up and Bobby Work churned past him to cut the tape in 9.7s.

## Swift Clocking

With Stanfield sidelined it was all McKibben in the furlong. The Oxy senior beat Chuck Peters by a good four yards in a 20.6s. clocking, swiftest on the Coast and equal to the best in the country.

Other meet highlights included Johnny Bradley's slim victory over the fast-closing Gary Green in a 47.7s. 440, Gray Berg's 9m. 25.2s. two-mile win with a surprising Whittier freshman, Russell Bonham, not far back, and a 6ft. 6 3/16 in. high jump by San Jose's Herman Wyatt.
