## Troy Trackmen Top Bears by 76-to-54 Tally

E D W A R D S ST A D I U M, BERKELEY, Cal., April 5—In an unbelievable form reversal, California's track team actually led SC's mighty Trojans for eleven events of their annual meet today.

Then Troy points rumbled with lightning quickness in the low hurdles, the broad jump, the discus and the relay, and Southern California carried off its tenth successive triumph over Berkeley, 76 1-6 to 54 56.

Awaiting the low hurdles, the Bears actually led by 52 5-6 to 46 1-6.

Upset in 440

The activity began according to Trojan plan. Art Garcia, best miler, withdrew while George Root and Martell Montgomery ran 1-2 through Len Simpson of Cal, third in 4:22.1, established his personal best mark, Root's winning gallop was 4:204.

That made the point cound 9-9. Next, John George, skinny 133pound transfer from Tuskegee who wears glasses taped to the sides of his head, outlegged teammate Guy Blackburn in a wind-sided 607. hundred, with Trojan Norm Stocks third and Al Mejia unplaced.

SC bounded back on the spikes of Jack Davis, who beat another maroon jerseyed man, Willard Wright, by six yards, in a :14 flat flight of high sticks not recognized as a meet record because of the 6.5 mp.h, favoring wind. Bear Lippincott was third.

Score tied, 18-18. Cal was figured to do well in the 850 but a sweep was unexpected. John Nelson picked off favored Lon Spurrier at the string in 1:57.2, with Gall Wetzork a reasonably close third.

The Cal point edge remained in the 220, when Norm Stocks' 21.8 was the winner, but again little George moved ahead of form for second, with Trojan Mejia third.

By this time field events were perking. California scored 11/2 points in the high jump, won by Trojan Jerry Kincheloe at 6ft.

## Trojans Miss 13ft.

The pole vault could never have been predicted. Dave Seed of Cal won at 13 feet, not his best, but Trojan Al Sandusky took second at 12ft. 6in. and third was a tie between Frank Johnson of SC and Larry Anderson, he of the missing fingers, at 12ft.

The point score remained in Cal's favor. It was 40½ to 31% by the ninth event, 47% to 42% at the 10th, and 52 5/6 to 46 1/6 through the 11th, in which Art Garcia won the two mile for SC by 60 yards, in 9:39.

## Turning Point

When the low hurdle results arrived. eight points for Troy and one for Cal, the meet swung over. At the conclusion of that event, it was SC 54 1/6-53 Then the rumble.
