# SC Swamps Tribe Trackmen, 90-40

Iness Spins Discus 174ft. 74in. for Record: Garcia Scores Double

Southern California did almost everything but drown the visiting Stanford Indians yesterday at the Coliseum and for a few minutes at the conclusion of their PCC track and field meet it appeared the Trojans might be about to add that ending to the contest.

The final score was 901/2 to 40%, which surpassed by a few points even the most liberal Troian leanings in premeet figuring.

## Clouds Threaten

For most of the afternoon the storm clouds threatened thunder rumbled. Then as the relay was started it began to pour, and the sturdiest survivors of the 3000 fans raced for the gates. And the Trojans, anchored by John Bradley, upset the favored Indians in a 3:17.6 clocking despite the flood of water. The Trojans put on a great

show of strength and indicated they are ready for a sparkling effort in their big one Friday night at the Coliseum with Texas and Texas A&M.

### New Meet Record

Sim Iness, the giant from Tulare, hung up the only meet record when he hurled the dis-cus 174ft. 74in., cracking Ken Carpenter's 16-year-old mark by more than nine feet. And second was Stanford's Bob Mathias, onetime teammate of Iness at Tulare High, with his best of the year at 167ft, 6in., also well beyond the meet record.

Southern California started the day with a surprise one-two finish in the shot where the Indians had been tabbed for the second and third spots.

Parry O'Brien had a great day, winning at 55ft. 11/2 in. on

his third try and bettering 54ft. on each of his last four attempts.

But Bob Van Doren uncorked his all-time best, 51ft, 81/2 in., and the Indians couldn't touch that, Mathias, held out of all competi-

tion but discus and shot due to an ailing leg, hit 49ft. 8in. and was unplaced.

In the first running race SC's Cocaptain Art Garcia scored an expected last lap win over Bob Simon in 4:15.7 after letting the Indian set all the early pace, Garcia outkicked Simon by 15 yards after passing him coming into the stretch.

#### Only Surprise

Garcia bounced back later in the two-mile to beat a fresh Indian, Bob Reed, by 20 yards in 9:22.5, missing the meet record by only a 10th of a second and completing a very swift double.

Stanford achieved its only surprise where Maury Parsons got an early edge on Al Mejia in the 100 and held it by lunging into the tape for a scant 6-inch margin in a slow :10.1. Officials said they were running into a 5-mile headwind. Jack Davis scored his expect-

ed double in the hurdles (clockers didn't see the flash of the starter's gun in the 220 and gave no official time, but unofficially it was around :23.3). Norm Stocks took the 220 as figured. the Trojans cleaned up in the pole vault and broad jump and
