

Sim Iness Hurles Discus 183ft. 5½ in.

EUGENE, Or., May 23 (AP)—Big Sim Iness of SC uncorked a prodigious discus throw of 183ft. 5½ in., more than three feet beyond the recognized American record, today in the Pacific Coast Conference meet preliminaries.

The American mark is 180ft. 2¼ in., set by Robert Fitch in 1946. The toss also bettered the American college mark of 178ft. 11¼ in., held by Fortune Gordien, Minnesota, 1948. Earlier this year Iness also eclipsed these marks with a pitch of 182ft. 5 in.

The world record is 186ft. 11 in., also set by Gordien.

Finals Today

Iness has another chance at the world mark in tomorrow's finals.

Iness' throw was far beyond the previous conference record of 170ft. 10¼ in. set in 1936 by Phil Levy of Stanford.

A wind, measured at 7 miles an hour, was quartering in from the north when Iness made his final throw toward the western stand in the stadium.

Just a few minutes earlier he had thrown the discus 180ft. 1 in.

Iness led an SC contingent that virtually clinched the title

tomorrow by performances in the qualifying events. If SC wins, it will be its 12th straight conference championship.

Parry O'Brien, SC shot-putter, bettered the Hayward Field record, and John Bradley, also of SC, tied the field record in the 440-yard dash.

O'Brien, Bradley Star

O'Brien tossed the shot 54ft. 3 in. The previous best on this field was 53ft. 4¼ in. by O'Brien here last year. The toss was some four feet short of the conference record.

Bradley raced the 440 in 48.5, equaling a field mark established last year by Cirilo McSween of Illinois. Bradley was more than two seconds off the conference record.

Jack Davis of SC led the qualifiers as expected in both hurdle events. Willard Wright added to possible SC points by winning his heat in the high hurdles in qualifying for the finals.

Flores Leads Brown

The 100-yard dash had no SC entrants and the favorite, Bill Felt of Oregon, had to withdraw because of a pulled muscle. Two UCLA men moved into the void, George Brown and Rod Richards each winning a heat. The same two won in the 220-yard dash, leading qualifiers for tomorrow's final.

Brown, who has turned in the year's best broad jumping failed to hit his peak in the broad jump. Twice he missed the take-off board and did not jump. On his other two efforts the best he could do was 23ft. ¼ in. Frank Flores of SC nosed him out with a jump of 23ft. 2 in.

SC also had no entrants in the javelin, and the favorite, Chuck Missfeldt of Oregon, led qualifiers with a creditable 223ft. 10 in.
