

# SC's O'Brien Tops in Shot, 2nd in Discus

EDWARDS FIELD, Berkeley, June 13—Three meet records were swept aside and another tied under an Olympic year impetus as the Southern California Trojans practically clinched their 16th title in the qualifying events of the National Collegiate Athletic Association Track and Field Championships here today.

Two records that had stood for 16 years were among those that disappeared during the afternoon's festivities, which saw only one final event, the 10,000-meter run.

Walter Deike of Wisconsin won this in 32:25.1, followed by Bob Kelly of Loyola (Chicago); Don Wyman of San Diego State, who was third; Dave Allison, Wooster, fourth, and Larry Carter, UCLA, fifth.

## Superb Efforts

The records that fell or were tied:

Shot-put — Parry O'Brien, Southern California, 57ft.  $\frac{5}{8}$ in., improving the record of 56ft. 11  $\frac{3}{16}$ in., posted by Jim Fuchs, Yale, in 1950.

Javelin—George Roseme, California, 228ft. 8  $\frac{1}{4}$ in., bettering the mark set by Alton Terry, Hardin-Simmons, at 226ft. 2  $\frac{1}{4}$ in. in 1936.

Hop, step and jump—George Shaw, Columbia, 49ft. 1  $\frac{3}{8}$ in., improving the 48ft. 5  $\frac{1}{8}$ in. figure posted by Herschel Neil, Northwest Missouri State, in 1936.

400-meter hurdles — Albin Rauch, Princeton, 52.4, equaling the previous best by George Walker, Illinois, in 1948.

## SC Takes Command

Frank Flores, Trojan jumper, also shattered the former hop, step and jump record in qualifying second with a mark of 48ft. 7  $\frac{1}{8}$ in.

Coach Jess Mortensen's powerful Trojans took command in the most convincing fashion possible.

Sim Iness set the pace among the discus throwers with a flip of 173ft. 2  $\frac{1}{8}$ in. in the platter event, with O'Brien a firm second, making the best discus toss of his career at 170ft. 4  $\frac{1}{8}$ in.

Jack Davis, favorite to successfully defend his high hurdles crown, not only turned in

the fastest qualifying mark in the 110-meter highs with an easy 14.1 win but then came back and posted the fastest 200-meter mark. He was clocked in 21.4.

So it was that the powerful quartet of O'Brien, Iness, Davis and Flores appeared to have enough points clinched among them to give SC its fourth straight title.

While the Trojans were dominating today's trials other Southland athletes were contributing in a large measure to the prestige of track and field's world capital, which is Southern California. With the possible exception of Occidental, entrants from Southland schools did everything that had been expected of them.

## Pep Star Wins

George Brown, UCLA's defending broad jump champion, fouled on all but one leap but this lone jump was good for 25ft. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. to lead J. Morgan Taylor of Princeton, who sailed out 24ft. 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. Flores of Troy qualified fifth at 24ft. 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.

Brown came back later to qualify in the 200-meter prelims, along with his teammate, Rod Richard, Norm Stocks of SC and Sherman Miller of Occidental.

Billy Johnson of Pepperdine was one of the three heat winners in the 400-meter hurdles and looked good in victory although his time of 53.5 was the slowest of the three. Jack Sage of UCLA was a qualifier in this heat, in second place.

Lee Yoder of Arkansas won the first heat in the good time of 52.8. Floyd Strain of Oxy failed to qualify in this heat.

## Barnes Fourth

Johnny Barnes, Occidental's bellwether, got quite a pushing around in his 800-meter trial but was an easy qualifier in fourth place in the fastest flight which Henry Cryer of Illinois won in 1:53.3. Barnes will have to hustle to defend his crown tomorrow because Ted Wheeler of Iowa and Stacey Siders of Illinois virtually tied in 1:53.8 for an easier two laps in the other half of the field.

Hal Butler of Oxy ran 1:36.3 for a fifth in the second heat just out of the money.

O'Brien's shot-put performance was a few inches back of his 57ft. 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. peak throw at Compton 10 days ago. He was almost three feet beyond Darrow Hooper's 54ft. 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. that put the Texas A&M star second.

## All by Themselves

Farry and Iness had even a wider edge in the discus. Sim's mark was almost six feet better than the third-place man, Charles Emery of Pennsylvania, and O'Brien had a three-foot edge. Des Koch of the Trojans was the seventh qualifier with a 158ft. 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. toss.

Southland athletes were shut out in the 100-meter semifinals, which were won by Willie Williams of Illinois in 10.8 and Tim Golliday of Northwestern in 10.4. Art Bragg, Morgan State, the

defending champion, finished third in the slower heat.

It took the Bulova phototimer to get Sherman Miller of Oxy fourth place in the 400-meter second semifinal which George Rhodes, defending champion from Morgan State, won in the fast time of 46.5.

J. W. Mashburn of Oklahoma was second in this heat and Jim Lea of SC third. Lea's time was 47.7 and Miller was clocked in 47.8.

Ollie Matson of USF captured the other heat in 47.1 as John Bradley of Troy failed to make the grade. With the Trojans a "mortal lock," as the horse racing guys say, tomorrow's interest will be confined strictly to individual performances.
