

# Five Records Fall in Coliseum Meet

Five marks fell by the boards despite the chill weather and four Olympic champions were beaten in the 13th annual Coliseum Relays before 35,979 shivering track and field fans at Memorial Coliseum last night.

Probably the outstanding upset of the evening came in the 440-yard dash when J. W. Mashburn, blond racer from Norman, Okla., ran away from George Rhoden, Jamaica's 400 meters victor at Helsinki, in 46.8.

Mashburn, who made the U.S. Olympic team, but didn't get a chance to run at Helsinki, clipped a tenth of a second off both the Coliseum and the Relays record.

## O'Brien Shines

Other new Relays marks turned in last night came in the half mile by Mal Whitfield, the shot-put by Parry O'Brien and the pole vault by Bob Richards.

In the next to final event of the evening Denis Johansson of Finland walked off with the "Miracle Mile" mile for the fifth record.

Besides Rhoden, the beaten Olympic champions were Slim Iness, discus; Walt Davis, high jump, and Jerome Biffle, broad jump.

## Richards High Flyer

Another Olympic titleholder, Lindy Remigino of Manhattan College, didn't get to run in the 100-yard dash and he and his teammates didn't get to defend their sprint relays titles

because of gastronomical disturbances.

Whitfield, Olympic 800-meter king, failed in his world-record try, as did all the others because of the chill night, but he clipped .7s off the relays mark in winning the half mile in 1:49.6. Johansson was clocked in 4:08.6. Compared with the mark of 4:11.4 set by Fred Wilt here in 1951.

O'Brien bettered his own record in the shot-put with a toss of 58ft. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ in; Richards, for the 46th time in his life, cleared 15ft. in winning the pole vault at 15ft. 9/16in. for the other record.

Jack Davis of Southern California was the only double winner of the evening. He walked off with the 120-yard high hurdles in 14.1 after hitting the ninth hurdle and then came back to take the 220-yard barriers event. He ran this in 23.2.

## SC Disqualified

The Trojans were deprived of a double victory in the sprint relay when a bad baton pass in the 880-yard relay brought forth a disqualification after winning by 15 yards. UCLA got the victory. SC's speedsters had made a walkaway of the 440-yard event in the absence of Manhattan.

However, they came back to take the mile relay from Manhattan by a scant yard in a sensational finish in 3:12.7. Occidental lost out when Brayton Norton dropped the baton.

Georgetown, after trailing through the first two half-miles, came up strong on the third hitch and captured the race by six yards from California in 7:34.2, fastest time for the nation this year.

## Stanfield Wins

Andy Stanfield, Olympic 200-meter champion, took the open 100 from Rod Richard of UCLA in 9.7, with Remigino on the sidelines.

The special mile relay was won by the Grand Street Boys Association of New York in 3:10.4, a little over two seconds faster than the performance of the Trojan mile quartet.

This team, composed of four

Olympic stars, Herb McKenley, Andy Stanfield, Rhoden and Whitfield, was shooting at the world's record but, cooled off by the weather, missed by almost two seconds.

The games were opened by Bill Henry, Los Angeles Times featured columnist, after he had received the Olympic Diploma from Avery Brundage, president of the International Olympic Committee.

Biffle saw George Brown, the former Bruin from Santa Clara Youth Center, win the broad jump with a leap of 23ft. 6 3/4 in.

Another Helsinki star to succumb was Walt Davis, who finished second to Ernie Shelton of SC in the high jump. The Trojan cleared 6ft. 7 1/2 in.
