

O'Brien Leads SC to Victory at Modesto

MODESTO, May 17 (AP)—Powerful Parry O'Brien came up with a double-barreled winning performance in the shot-put and discus events last night to lead Southern California to a team victory in the 12th annual California Relays.

O'Brien propelled the 16-pound shot 53ft. 11in. and won the discus with a throw of 160ft. 9in. USC piled up 63½ points to take team honors. California was second with 40.

Whitfield Wins Two

Only other double winner was Mal Whitfield of the Grand Street Boys Club, New York. He led the field in a comparatively slow half-mile with a time of 1:53. Whitfield stepped up the pace considerably in winning the 600-yard dash in 1:00.3—one-tenth of a second off the American record set 20 years ago by Ben Eastman of Stanford.

Georgetown University's crack relay team won the 2½-mile medley in 10:03.5—fastest time recorded for the event this year.

Oxy Spills

The night's most spectacular finish saw California win the two-mile relay in a thrilling duel with Occidental. Lon Spurrier of the Bears fought off the Tigers' Don Monroe at the wire and the latter fell right at the finish. When a teammate helped Monroe across the line, the team was disqualified. The time was comparatively slow, 7:46.4.
