O'Brien, incidentally, claims a new world mark of 59ft. 3/4 in., established at Fresno earlier this month.

Southern California's Jack Davis, one of the meet's double winners, equalled 120-yard high hurdle time of 14 seconds flat set in 1950 by a former Trojan -Dick Attlesey, Davis also won the low hurdles in 23.2.
