

Trojans Romp to 13th PCC Track Title in Row

STANFORD STADIUM, May 30 (AP) — Southern California, the colossus of college track and field, won the Pacific Coast track and field championships today for the 13th year in a row.

SC scored 59 $\frac{1}{2}$ points, California was second with 37 $\frac{1}{2}$ and the rest of the team scoring went like this: Stanford, 30 $\frac{1}{2}$; Washington State, 27 $\frac{1}{2}$; UCLA, 24 $\frac{1}{2}$; Oregon and Washington, 14; Idaho, 10 $\frac{1}{2}$; Oregon State, 7.

World Mark

The Trojans, besides grabbing the most points, accounted for one new meet record and another one tied.

Parry O'Brien, who makes shot-putting something of an athletic art, sent the 16-pound iron ball 58ft. 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. to erase the mark of 57ft. 4 $\frac{3}{8}$ in. set in 1950 by Otis Chandler of Stanford.

O'Brien, incidentally, claims a new world mark of 59ft. $\frac{3}{4}$ in., established at Fresno earlier this month.

Southern California's Jack Davis, one of the meet's double winners, equalled 120-yard high hurdle time of 14 seconds flat set in 1950 by a former Trojan — Dick Attlessey. Davis also won the low hurdles in 23.2.

The 23rd conference championship also marked the farewell to collegiate competition

of Stanford two-time Olympic decathlon champion — Bob Mathias.

Mathias came up in the meet's iron-man role. He was second in the low barriers—a finish so close he received the same time as the winner, Davis.

Big Bob also took third in the high hurdles, fourth in the shot-put with a heave of 50ft. 4 $\frac{3}{8}$ in. and placed third in the discus with 160ft. 6 $\frac{1}{8}$ in.

The crowd of 7500 gave Stanford's greatest track and field athlete a rousing ovation when he was presented with a traveling bag by San Francisco sports writers.

Poses for Pictures

He and his fiancée, Melba Wisner of Vallejo, posed for pictures. They will be married June 17. Mathias reports to the U. S. Marine Corps next fall.

Earlier today the 22-year-old star was presented with a lifetime membership in the Stanford Alumni Association.

Rod Richard of UCLA was the other double winner, taking the 100-yard dash in 9.8 and the 220 in 21.4.

Northern Division schools took the honors in javelin throw, 2-mile run, pole vault and broad jump.

The winning spear toss was 208ft. $\frac{5}{8}$ in. by Ralph Sutton of Oregon State, the defending champion. The four other place

winners all were over 200 feet.

Al Fisher, Washington State, topped the two-mile run in 9:17.8; Ray Packwood, Oregon, cleared 13ft. 9in. to win the pole vault, and Darrell Skartvedt of Washington leaped 23ft. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. for first in the broad-jump.

SC's Davis had to come from behind to beat Mathias by inches in a blazing fast 23.2 flight of the 220-yard low hurdles.

O'Brien grabbed a second in the discuss throw behind his Olympic champion teammate, Sam Iness. Iness' winning toss was 174ft. $\frac{3}{4}$ in. O'Brien heaved one 168ft. 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.
