A number of SC sophomores and transfers made impressive debuts, including Javelin-tosser Doug Maijala (191ft. 101/2 in.), Broad-jumper Jon Arnett (23ft, 4½in.), Pole-vaulter Walt Levack (13ft, 9in.) and Discustosser Leon Patterson (168ft. 6¼ in.).

The best Trojan distance man proved to be Dick Adams, running on the second SC team. His 4:25.8 mile was his best ever and he also had a 1:58.6 half mile.
