

Trojans Roll Over Bears by Big Edge

EDWARDS STADIUM, Berkeley, April 24—Southern California's steam-roller track team defeated the University of California varsity here today, 86% to 44%, just about as expected, after an afternoon of brilliant performances before a crowd of 5500.

Standout performer was the Trojan co-captain, Jimmy Lea who started off with a 47 second quarter-mile, the world's fastest this year, followed by an easy second to Howard Bugbee in the 220 and climaxed by a come-from-behind anchor leg in the year's fastest mile relay, 3:15.1.

Coach Brutus Hamilton's strong California team started off the afternoon with a burst of energy. Charley Butt and John Stellern of the Bears successively broke their own university record in the shot-put on their first attempts. Stellern, a junior from Pasadena, won at 54ft. 8in., followed by Butt's 53ft. 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., both exceeding the 53-9 mark of which they had been coholders.

Surprise Entry

Lon Spurrier, a surprise entry in the mile for Cal, upset Teammate Len Simpson and Trojan Marty Montgomery, winning in 4:16.4, very creditable time for the second mile race of his life. Simpson's second-place finish momentarily put the Bears in a 16-2 lead, but from then on the Trojans poured on the pressure.

Trojans Joe Graffio and Bugbee outsprinted Cal's Guy Blackburn in a good 9.7 100-yard dash. Blackburn, a Los Angeles resident, appeared to have recovered from a leg injury which kept him out of last week's UCLA-Cal meet.

Bill Taylor, Troy's consistent half-miler, surprised Spurrier and Ed Wilson by taking the 880 in 1:54.7.

Troy Sweep

Bugbee led a Troy sweep in the 220, winning in 21.4 ahead of Lea and Pat Coyle.

Fernando Ledesma won his first two-mile of the year in a

convincing manner. His clocking, 9:23.4, was almost 13 seconds faster than Trojan Dick Adams.

Des Koch, the Trojan's remarkable all-around athlete, got off a tremendous last-throw effort of 213 feet to upset Cal's Dick Righter in the javelin. Righter had just gone into the lead with the nation's second best spear toss of the season.
