Terrill Wins Record 4:13.9 Mile; SC Relay Runs 3:16

Everybody had a winning day at the annual Southern California-Occidental track and field gathering yesterday.

Southern California won the varsity meet, 85½ to 50½, having a little more difficulty than anticipated.

Occidental captured the freshman competition, 85 to 46, a little more easily than expected.

Each varsity squad contributed one new meet record.

And the 5000 fans, who made up the largest throng ever to see a track encounter at Oxy, were rewarded with one of the lest-conducted spike sport gatherings seen locally in some time.

No one, outside possibly of Coach Payton Jordan, thought Oxy could amass 50 points against the powerful Trojans.

Tigers Come Through

But they did it by coming through with improved performances in any number of instances.

The day's outstanding single mark was the mile time of 4:13.9 by Oxy's co-captain, Jim Terrill. It was his best ever, the swiftest locally this year, and came early in the program to give the Tigers quite a lift.

Terrill slipped past SC's Marty Montgomery on the inside lane with 220 to go and ran away to win by 20 yards. Fernando Ledesma, alling Trojan ace, ran third after making a bid on the third lap.

Terrill cracked a meet record set by a pretty fair miler, Bob McMillen, 4:14.7, two years ago.

Oxy Leads Early

The other new meet standard was m the concluding mile relay when SC put together a slife, equal to the best in the nation, as Jim Lea anchored in def. Lea made up about six yards on Oxy's Brayton Norton, hen went on to beat him by hen went on to beat him by in 47.7 and the Oxy team in 31.64. Both team times were under SC's 31.7.4 record of last year.

Oxy was in the amazing position of leading SC after four

Howard Bugbee edged Joe Grafio in a 9.7 century, SC sweeping the race. Bugbee later took the 220 in 21.5 to be the only double winner. Willard Wright paced a one-two punch in the high hurdles. And along about this time SC strength in the broad jump, javelin, discus and high jump was becoming evident.
