

# SC Beats Texas Spikers, Smith Speeds 9.3 100

DALLAS, May 1 — Though many performers fell far below their previous best marks Southern California's NCAA track and field kings scored a clear-cut win over Texas, Texas A&M and Southern Methodist in a quadrangular meet before 8000 fans here tonight.

The Trojans tallied 73½ points to Texas' 50, A&M's 34½ and SMU's 16.

Gusty winds pushed the sprinters and hurdlers to splendid efforts.

## **Smith Runs 9.3 100**

Texas' Dean Smith and Charley Thomas clearly established their superiority over Joe Gaffio and Howard Bugbee in the sprints but Trojan Des Koch was the meet's outstanding athlete. Smith beat Gaffio off the blocks and at 10 yards had a clear margin as he ran a world-record equaling 9.3 in the 100. An announced aiding wind of 7.56 m.p.h. was with the runners. Gaffio was a yard back, inches ahead of Thomas, who was missed by the judges. Bugbee closed fast but was never a contender.

## **Koch Weight Star**

Powerful Thomas looked easy in going the furlong in 20.5 with the wind pegged at 7.6. Gaffio was 1 yard behind and a like distance separated him and Bugbee. Bugbee appeared to be favoring a month-old leg ailment.

Double Winner Koch took the javelin on his last effort, had a lifetime best of 52ft.

for shot-put runner-up honors and won the discus.

A soft take-off from yesterday's heavy rain hindered Trojan Ernie Shelton's bid for a world record in the high jump. He won at 6ft. 9 $\frac{1}{4}$ in. on his first try but didn't come too close at 6ft. 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ in.

### Distance Men Fail

The Steers won the 440 relay around two curves in a fine 40.8, with SC 4 yards back after leading to the last exchange. Jim Lea, after loafing the 440, narrowed nine of a 12-yard deficit in the mile relay and clocked 47.7 but couldn't nail SMU's Don Morton, the Mustang, clocking 3:16.5.

The Trojan distance men did a wholesale el foldo. Fernando Ledesma was outgunned in the mile, as was Bill Taylor in the 880 and Dave Bungay in the two mile. All followed a slow place and never really were contenders.

### Few Best Marks

Hurdlers Will Wright and John Morgan scored wins with 14.4 and 23.1 timings, though the wind was still prevailing. It bucked the broad jumpers, as the poor marks will indicate, while it fouled up the pole vault where SC's Dick Hecht won at 12ft. 6in. and Walt Levack of Troy couldn't go higher than 11ft. 6in.

Only the wind-pushed sprinters and hurdlers plus Koch in the shot improved on seasonal bests. Trojan Ledesma attempted to double in the two mile but dropped back from the pack almost immediately and never challenged the leaders. Ron

Loy bowed out in the lows after two flights with a bum back.
