The Trojans tallied 73½ points to Texas' 50, A&M's 34½ and SMU's 16.

Gusty winds pushed the sprinters and hurdlers to splendid efforts.

Texas' Dean Smith and Charley Thomas Clearly established their superiority over Joe Graffio and Howard Bugbee in the sprints but Trojan Des Koch was the meet's outstanding athlete. Smith beat Grafilo off the blocks and at 10 yards had a clear margin as he ran a worldrecord equaling 9.3 in the 100. An announced aiding wind of 7.56 m.p.b. was with the runners. Graffio was a yard back, inches ahead of Thomas, who was missed by the judges. Bugbee closed fast but was never a contender.
