

SC Wins 14th PCC in Row

Shelton, Meyer, Long Crack Records in Meet

SEATTLE, May 29 (AP)—Conference records in the javelin, two mile and high jump were brushed aside today as Southern California's Trojans piled up 70 points to win their 14th consecutive Pacific Coast Conference track and field championship.

Ernie Shelton of SC, jumping into the teeth of a cold and gusty wind, squeezed over the bar at 6ft. 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. to beat by that one-eighth of an inch the high-jump record set in 1941 by Les Steers of Oregon.

Meyer Does 9:09.1

Denny Meyer of Washington, sprinting the entire last lap, won the two-mile by 20 yards in 9:09.1. This bettered the mark of 9:12.5 posted by Dixie Garner of Washington State in 1940.

Leo Long of Stanford threw the javelin 256ft. 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. to lengthen by 3 feet his own record set only yesterday.

Also standing up as a record is the 9.5 seconds in which Joe Graffio of SC ran the 100-yard dash during yesterday's preliminaries. Bucking the breeze in today's finals, Graffio went the distance in 9.7 seconds.

Bears Second

California was second with 59 points and Stanford third with 35 $\frac{1}{2}$. Other scores: Washington State 16; UCLA, 15; Oregon, 13 $\frac{1}{2}$; Washington 13; Oregon State, 7; Idaho, 6.

Expected to finish just where they did, California's Bears got away to an early lead and were 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ points ahead of Southern Cal after eight events. But then the muscle-men of Troy took three places in the discus and the same in the 220, and bounced 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ points in front.

The meet produced one dead heat, Gerry Wood of Stanford and Will Wright of SC hitting the tape together in the 120-yard high hurdles. Wright closed a slight gap in the last 10 strides to earn his tie.

Gary, Lea Tie

Bob Gary of Washington State was the high-point man with 9, earned on his place in the 220 and second in the 100.

The relay produced perhaps the day's top surprise. Southern California, expected to win it handily and break the 3:12.3 record, lost out to a determined Stanford foursome. Wood took the baton in the second lap to put Stanford in front. By the last lap the Indians had a 20-yard advantage and Wilger was two yards short of closing the gap at the finish.
