

TROY BREEZES PAST ARIZONA, 100 $\frac{1}{2}$ -30 $\frac{1}{2}$

TUCSON, Ariz., March 26. A bothersome wind held down the performances by Southern California's national championship track team here today as the Trojans won their annual dual meet with the University of Arizona, 100 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 30 $\frac{1}{2}$.

Mike Larrabee, SC's anchor man, held off the closing spurt of Clarence Anderson of the Wildcats to win the mile relay event by six inches in the most exciting race of the day. The 3:19.9 time for both teams was just ordinary. Anderson, the big football player from Los Angeles, made up about five yards on Larrabee, who had already won the 440, but couldn't quite get to the tape first.

Outstanding marks of the afternoon were turned in by Mal Andrews of Arizona with a 24-10 $\frac{1}{2}$ broad jump and by

Trojans Ray Martin with a 54-4 $\frac{1}{2}$ effort in the shot and Ernie Shelton with a 6-9 high jump.

Andrews, another L.A. immigrant to Tucson, is the nation's leading varsity long jumper to date. Trojan grid star Jon Arnett was second at 23-4 $\frac{1}{2}$.

Cocaptain Howard Bugbee was a double winner for Troy, taking the 100 into the teeth of the breeze in 10 flat and then striding through the 220 around the turn in 21.3, a remarkably fast clocking.

Trojan distance aces Sid Wing and Fernando Ledesma won the mile and two mile in good 4:18.0 and 9:29.7 times, respectively, considering the buffeting they got from the air currents.

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ona's only other first with a 14.8 win in the high hurdles. Later in the afternoon he was favored to add the lows to his credit, but got ejected from the race for two false starts.

Trojan sophs Bob Voiles and Marshall Clark were surprise winners in the javelin and half-mile, each coming up with his best-ever effort.

Voiles threw 199ft. 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ in., while Clark was running twice around the track in 1:56.5. Another SC soph, Ron Morris, got over 14 feet in the pole vault without the wind pushing the bar off the pins.

Today's dual was Coach Jess Mortensen's last prep for the big Occidental-SC meet in the Coliseum next Saturday.
