Mt. San Antonio's Chuck Kirkby, aiming for a national junior college mile record, fell short of the target by more than three full seconds but nonetheless won a thrilling duel from SC Freshman Max Truex in the four-lapper that featured yesterday's double dual track meet at Riverside.

A crowd of some 1500 fans watched Kirkby pass by Truex at the start of the final lap and go on to win in 4:19.4 with the towhead Trojan mite two yards behind at 4:19.7. The national JC record is 4:16.1.

Trobabe Wes McLeod was scratched from the race early yesterday when X rays of his lower shinbone disclosed a possible slight fracture.

**Kitchen Scampers**

Bruce Kitchen ran his fastest quarter mile of the season when the frosh flash turned one curve in 48.8. A step behind him came Teammate Bob Harman in exceptional 48.9 time. Mt. SAC's Vic Barris was third at 49.4.

Harman was clocked at 48.9 and Tom Anderson at a blistering 47.8 on quarter-mile legs of the mile relay, which the Trojans won in 3:19.3.

**Mal in Exhibition**

L.A. Athletic Club's Mal Whitfield, former holder of the world's 880 record, scooted around the oval twice and won a special half-mile exhibition race. Whitfield waltzed around in 1:55.2, beating Jim Lea of LAAC (1:55.5).

On the field, Trobabe Ray Taylor unleashed his longest javelin throw of 191ft. 8in. while his teammate, Dick Bronson, was moving the shot 52ft. 11in.

**Lawson Scores Heavily**

Bob Lawson, competing in six events, contributed 23 points for Troy, which easily whipped the Mt. San Antonio team, 74½-56½. Mt. San Antonio was a 104½-22½ winner over Riverside in the JC scoring.

Danny Schweikart of Fullerton set a new seasonal JC best time of 9:43.1 by taking the two mile in a meet at Santa Ana.

Metropolitan Conference meets at both Harbor and Long Beach were canceled because of puddle-pocked tracks sopped up by Thursday's rain.
