

# SC Spikesters Easily Dispose of Texas Foes

DALLAS, April 30 — SC's powerful Trojans easily out-distanced three Texas track rivals as Troy's Ernie Shelton failed in an attempt to break the world's high jump record and a smooth-passing Texas 440-relay team tied the world standard before 8371 fans in sweltering heat at Dal-Hi Stadium tonight.

Jess Mortensen's NCAA title defenders scored 83¼, and were followed by Texas, 50, Texas A&M, 24¼, and SMU, 15½.

### Smith Spurts

A great lead-off by Dean Smith of the Longhorns got his team off in front and near-perfect exchanges saw Alvin Frieden, Jerry Prewit and Bobby Whilden build up the margin to clock 40.5 to tie SC's record of 1938 and Texas' two runs of last year. The previous marks were run around one turn but tonight the Steers did it around two.

Shelton cleared 6ft. 8in. easily but a soft takeoff halted him at 6ft. 10in. though all three tries were close. The mercury hovered close to a humid 90 deg. though there was practically no wind. After a 3 m.p.h. reading early in the evening, it dropped off. The distance runners seemed bothered but the rest of the competitors thrived on the heat.

Smith was an easy winner

in both sprints with 9.5 and 21.2 efforts. SC's Howard Bugbee was unplaced in the 100 and scratched from the 220. His leg was not aggravated but Mortensen was taking no chances.

Troy's Mike Larrabee raced to a sparkling 47.8 two-turn quarter and hit the tape full of run, 7 yards ahead of Don Morton of SMU. Lanky Dick Foerster of Texas won a stretch duel with teammate Tom Rogers in a good 1:51.7.

### Upset Win

Marty Montgomery scored an upset win in the mile in 4:15.3 with favored Sid Wing falling back to third after a suicidal 61.2 first lap.

Sophomore Bob Voiles of SC got off a cast of 205ft. 10-in. to win javelin honors, an improvement of 6½ft. over his best.

The concluding mile relay was the most exciting race of the night with SMU's Morton staving off a rush by Foerster of Texas to win by 1 yard in 3:13.0. Foerster closed all by

8 yards on the Mustang anchorman. SC ran 3:14.5.

Two great performers shone in the accompanying high school feature. Eddie Southern of Dallas Sunset High won the hurdles in 14.1 and 19.1 and took the 220 in 21.0. Abilene's Bob Mosshart finished strong in a 1:54.3 half mile.

The Trojans return home tomorrow night on American Airlines Flight 965 and arrive at Burbank at 8 p.m.
