

SC Romps Over Tribe, Top Marks Plentiful

PALO ALTO, May 10—In an evening of outstanding performances, the SC track and field team smashed Stanford, 85½ to 45½, today.

The meet postponed from April 30 and run as a "commuters special" at twilight, before 5500 fans, featured a 239ft. 1½in. javelin throw by Stanford's Bob Kimball and 14ft. 9¾in. pole vaulting by Trojans Walt Levack and Ron Morris.

In addition to the javelin and pole vault, three other meet records were set and one was tied—all by Trojans.

New Sky Twins

The twin vaults by Levack and Morris, each clearing on his first try, rank as the fourth best in intercollegiate com-

petitive history. Only Don Laz (who holds the national record of 15ft. 1¾in), Don Cooper and Bill Sefton and Earl Meadows ever have jumped higher. It was Sefton's and Meadows' meet mark of 14ft. 8½in. that was broken. Levack and Morris failed three times at 15ft. ½in.

Montgomery Runs 4:10.8

Kimball, on his third try, threw the javelin 239ft. 7½in. to better the intercollegiate mark of 237ft. 10in. set by Bill Miller of Arizona State, Tempe, in the 1951 Modesto Relays.

The other meet records were earned by Montgomery, who won easily over Team-

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mate Sid Wing in a 4:10.8 mile (second best in the nation this year); Pat Coyle who came from nowhere for a 9.6 hundred and meet record share, and Fernando Ledesma's smooth-striding two miles in 9:15.

Ernie Shelton won at 'only' 6ft. 8½in. in the high jump, missing three tries at 6ft. 10¾in.

Trojan Mike Larrabee, who earlier had won the 440 in 48, made up a four-yard deficit and added four of his own beating Stanford's Walt Garrett.
