

Oregon's Reiser Runs 9:02.6 as SC Walks Off With Title

EUGENE, Or., May 28 — Ken Reiser of Oregon raced to the year's fastest collegiate two-mile clocking today—9:02.6—to highlight the annual Pacific Coast Conference track and field championships.

As expected, Southern California wrapped up its 15th consecutive team title with 65 points.

Ledesma Third

In winning the two mile Reiser not only cracked the meet record (9:09.1 by Denny Meyer of Washington in 1954) but beat two of the nation's top two milers—Bobby Hunt of UCLA and Fernando Ledesma of SC.

Hunt, who has run 9:12.5,

was second, while Ledesma, who has a previous best of 9:09.5, finished third.

Reiser's teammate, Bill Dellinger, fought off UCLA's Bobby Seaman in a stretch duel in the mile to win in 4:09 — another meet record. The old mark was 4:09.3 by Phil Liebowitz of Idaho in 1941.

Dellinger started slowly, but finding the pace too slow for him moved up to take the lead in the second lap and then fought off a closing sprint by Seaman.

The Trojans won only two track events, the 220-yard low hurdles and 440, but scored heavily in the field events to wrap up their title. SC scored firsts in the shot-put (Ray Martin, 56ft. 2½in.); discus (Des Koch, 169ft. 6¾in.); high jump (Ernie Shelton, 6ft. 10in.) and pole vault (Ron Morris, 14ft. 7in.).

Clarke Surprises

Shelton barely missed at a world record height of 7 feet. He seemingly went over his final try only to have the bar, which he barely brushed, fall off.

His winning height set a new record, replacing the mark of 6ft. 9¾in. he had set last year.

Trojan track winners were

Mike Larrabee in 440 (47.8) and Leon Clarke in the lows (24). Clarke, who had failed to win in dual meets with UCLA and Stanford, was a surprise victor.

The only double winner of the meet was Bob Gary of Washington State. Gary won the 100 in 9.9 and the 220 in 21.2.

UCLA was runner-up to the Trojans with 44½ points while Stanford was a close third with 43 points.
