Thomson has a best this year of 13.8 in his favorite race. Larrabee was the day's only casualty via the gun-jumping route. The starter, Willard Greim, wore a microphone over his shoulders and his every command was audible to the 3870 in the stands. Caltech's Phil Conley held the NCAA javelin record for about three minutes. He cut loose with a toss of 231ft. 5in. to erase the NCAA standard of 228ft. 8% in. established by California's George Roseme in 1952. Then along came BYU's Chuck Higgins with a 232ft. 5in, throw to beat him and Oregon State's Gerry Church sailed one out 232ft. 6in. to lead everybody.
