

Arnett Leaps 25Ft. to Set Meet Mark

DALLAS, April 27 (AP)—Southern California won its third straight Dallas Invitational track and field meet tonight with a smashing total of 80½ points, with seven records set and one tied, six of them by SC.

The mighty Trojans, national champions for seven straight years, won the meet by their second lowest margin—24. They beat Texas, which had 56 points; Texas A&M, 29½, and Southern Methodist, 8.

Arnett Cuts Loose

All except two of the records were set in the field events where the burly Trojans ruled virtually supreme.

The giants of the field from Southern California had a field day. Jon Arnett broad-jumped 25ft. Ray Martin shoved the shot 56ft. 2in., Walt Levack vaulted 14ft., Doug Maijala threw the javelin 214ft. 2in. and Rink Babka hurled the discus 173ft. 1in. for records.

Stubby Max Truex of SC raced the two mile in 9:16.3 for the other Trojan record.

Furlong Mark

Bobby Whilden of Texas made the other record—racing the 220-yard dash in 20.4 to wipe out the mark of 20.5 set by Charles Thomas of Texas in 1954. Whilden also won the 100-yard dash, doing it in 9.5 despite a 20-m.p.h. cross wind that handicapped all the runners. Whilden was high-point man of the meet with 11½.

A crowd of 8300 saw the meet.
