

# Three Meet Records Fall as Trojan Tracksters Rout California, 86-45

Southern California thumped California in resounding fashion, 86-45, yesterday at the Coliseum to set the stage for the dual meet gigantic with UCLA next Saturday.

The Trojans won eased up, with four prospective point winners kept on the side-

lines. All are recovering from minor ailments and Coach Jess Mortensen wanted to make sure they are ready for the Bruins.

The inactive Trojans were Tom Anderson, 880; Larry Gilbert, sprints; Mal Robertson, two mile, and Ernest Bullard, pole vault.

"They could have com-

peted today," Mortensen said, "but why take a chance"?

Three meet records fell during yesterday's meet, witnessed by a select gathering of 2891 fans.

The most impressive performance was by Cal's Don Bowden, who seemed headed for new world-record time in the 880 with half a lap to go. He finished in 1:49.7, equaling his best of the year, after setting an amazing pace.

The tall Bear junior covered the first lap in 52.5 and was timed in 1:20 at the 660 point. Had he kept up the pace for the last furlong he would have finished in something under Lon Spurrier's 1:47.5 world standard but he wasn't quite up to it.

Don had been sidelined for two weeks due to a slight muscle cramp. In another

week or two he should be ready for a big one.

Max Truex sped to an 8:57.3 two-mile clocking, shaking off Cal's Bob House after a head-and-shoulders duel for six laps. House's 9:03.9 mark broke his own Bear record.

Ron Morris pole-vaulted 14ft. 9 $\frac{3}{4}$ in., raising his meet mark by the fraction. Bob Lawson equaled Phil Cope's 21-year-old meet record of 14.3 in the high hurdles.

California's Leamon King was an easy and impressive double sprint victor in 9.9 and 21.5, far from sensational times, but the old Coliseum downdraft on the 100 straightaway still prevails. Monte Upshaw made his year's debut for the Bears but trailed in last place in the 100 and wasn't much better off in the low hurdles.

A number of Trojans posted season's best. C. R. Roberts broad-jumped 24ft. 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ in. Carl Self put the shot 52ft. 7 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. for second behind Ray Martin's 53ft. 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ in., and Mike Page completed an SC javelin sweep with a 209ft. 9in. third-place mark.

Ramon Lopez started for the first time since the AAU Relays and had a good 48.9 440 lap and a strong finish in the 220, where he was third. Chuck Kirkby's season debut was a 1:53.4 second-place spot in the 880, far out-distanced by Bowden but a creditable first outing.
