

TROY CAPTURES PCC EASILY; BOB SEAMAN DISQUALIFIED

EUGENE, Or., May 18 (AP) Southern California won its 16th Pacific Coast Conference track title in 17 years with ease in a surprise-filled meet today.

Southern California surprised nearly everyone by the margin of its victory, for UCLA, the team that ousted SC from the title last year,

had been expected to make it a close contest.

Oregon snatched second place away from UCLA.

Southern California scored 67 points, Oregon 39½, UCLA 38, Stanford 29, California 22, Washington 16, Idaho 7, Oregon State 3½ and Washington State 3.

UCLA, 1956 national collegiate champion, suffered

repeated disappointments, starting with the first race of the day.

In that one, the mile, favored Bob Seaman of UCLA was disqualified in a stretch drive with Sid Wing of Southern California who broke the tape first.

Wing Pushed

Seaman was disqualified, however, for pushing Wing across several lanes in the final sprint. That blanked UCLA in the event, giving Wing first place, followed by Jim Grelle of Oregon, Ray Hatton of Idaho, Ray Hale of Southern California and Maynard Orme of California.

Also surprising was the fact that four conference records were broken. A track made heavy by a driving rain yesterday and a few showers today had been expected to make for mediocre performances.

Records were broken in the 880, the javelin, the pole vault and the two-mile race.

Bowden's 1:47.8

Don Bowden of California ran the third fastest 880 in the history of track as he led an outstanding field to the tape.

Bowden's time was 1:47.8, just three-tenths of a second off the world mark set by another Californian, Lon Spurrier, Jim Bailey of Oregon chased Bowden all the way but could not overtake him.

The fifth-place man, Dick Boyce of Idaho, equaled the previous conference mark of 1:51.6, established by Hugh Mitchell of UCLA in 1951.

California ousted his teammate and the favorite, Bob Voiles, in the javelin throw. Majjala's distance was 236ft. 7½in. Voiles was second at 229ft. 10½in.

Max Truex of Southern California cracked the two-mile conference record, running it in 8:57.5.

Ron Morris of Southern California cracked the pole

vault record of 14ft. 11in. set by Earle Meadows and Earl Sefton, both of SC in 1937. Morris vaulted 15ft. ¾in.

Leamon King of California and Bob Lawson of SC each won two events. King won the 100 and 220-yard sprints. Lawson captured both the high and low hurdle titles.
