

# Bell Broad-Jumps 26ft. 7in.

AUSTIN, Tex., June 14 (AP) Bobby Morrow tied the world 100-yard dash record and Greg Bell turned in a prodigious broad jump that nipped at a world mark to pace a parade of Olympians through the preliminaries of the 36th annual NCAA track championships tonight.

Morrow, Abilene Christian's triple gold medal winner at Melbourne, flashed to a 9.3 century dash to match a mark shared by five others, while Indiana's Bell soared 26ft. 7in. to eclipse every other leap in track history except the 22-year-old mark of 26ft. 8 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. set by Jesse Owens back in 1935.

## No Upsets

There wasn't a major upset in the opening night's action before 5000 fans in the University of Texas' Memorial Stadium as Villanova's Wildcats continued to loom as the team to beat for the title that has been roosting on the West Coast for so many years.

The Wildcats' big man, Distance Runner Ron Delany from Ireland, easily qualified for his expected 880-yard duel with California's Don Bowden in tomorrow night's finals and Weightman Ken Bantum paced the shot-putters with 57ft. 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. and was among those qualifying behind Kansas' Al Oerter in the discus.

Delany, who was timed in 1:52.1 to 1:51.2 for Bowden in separate heats, also will try to defend his mile crown tomorrow night in a try for a double victory. There was no mile preliminary tonight.

## Into Finals

Besides Morrow, Bell and Delany, the other Olympic winners breezing into the finals include Bantum in the shot-put, Lee Calhoun of North Carolina College in the high hurdles and Villanova's Charley Jenkins in the 440-yard dash.

Villanova also earned potential points from Ed Collymore, who nosed out a coasting Morrow in one of the semifinal heats of the 220-yard dash in the slow time of 21.4 seconds.

Morrow beat Ira Murchison of Western Michigan by a stride in the second qualifying heat of the century dash with only a 3-m.p.h. wind at his back. Murchison also was timed in 9.3.

## Wins Highs

Lee Calhoun from North Carolina College qualified easily in his specialty at 14.0 seconds, but then scratched from the low hurdles.

Elias Gilbert of Winston-Salem and Ancel Robinson of Fresno State also were timed in 14 flat in the highs and Robinson paced the prelim-

inary heats in the lows in 22.6 to 22.7 for Gilbert.

Stanford's chances of contending for the championship dwindled when Broad Jumper Frank Herrmann fouled out on all four preliminary jumps. On the basis of his best season efforts he had been expected to pick up either second or third behind Bell.
