

Occidental in 2-Mile Relay Win

Distance Medley at Fresno Track Bagged by Bears

FRESNO, May 10 — California won the heralded distance medley relay in the 32nd annual West Coast Relays here tonight but in slow time and Oxy, keeping its stars out, came back to win the 2-mile chase in record time.

An expectant crowd of 13,500 saw the Bears run on a world-record pace on the 440 and 880 legs of the medley, but Maynard Orme could contribute only 3:02.2 on the three-lap leg and Don Bowden finished up with a 4:11.8 mile, just coasting.

The total time was 9:51.2 as against the 9:42 clocking they were shooting at. Jack Yerman did 47 flat for the 440 and Jerry Siebert 1:50.2 on his 880.

Big Bid

Both Oxy and SC elected to make their big bid in the two-mile affair, but at the wire it was Ty Hadley, smashing Trojan Wes McLeod for a 15-yard margin. Oxy's time, 7:29.9, lowered the previous best of 7:32.5.

The individual events on the track went pretty much according to form. Ancel Robinson of Fresno State got off to a fine start in the high hurdles and steadily moved ahead to win in 14.2. He was some three yards ahead of Chuck Cobb of Stanford and Clarence Treat of Oxy, who tied for second.

Norton Sprints 9.4

In the 100 finals Ray Norton of San Jose State, who sped a wind-aided 9.3 earlier this season, won by two feet in 9.4. Norton and Dee Givens of Oklahoma got the best starts but Norton surged ahead at 40 yards and was a clear winner. Willie White of California was away slowly but closed fast for third. It was Norton's fifth 9.4 century this season.

In the only open division event of the afternoon Rink Babka took the discus prize with a spin of 186ft. even. This bettered the meet mark of 184ft. 1½in. made by Parry O'Brien in 1954. Babka's buddy, Jack Egan, made it the customary 1-2 with an effort of 174ft. 8¾in.

The meet record in the junior college shot-put fin-

ished with a blaze. Homer Robertson of San Bernardino equaled the mark of 53ft. 4in. on his last turn with only two men left. Jim Wade of Taft then went ahead with 53ft. 8½in., and Mike Lewis of San Francisco climaxed the event with a heave of 53ft. 11in.

UCLA's Rafer Johnson, still confined to the weight events, made the best of it by winning the javelin from a star-studded field with his best-ever mark, 238ft. 11in. Another collegian, SC's steadily improving Mike Page, was second at 235ft. 7in., while the veteran Bud Heid, who holds the meet record at 262ft. 2¼in., was third at 233ft. 10in.
