

Trojans Still Favored in NCAA Meet, but Kansas Poses Threat

BERKELEY, June 13 —

After a hectic session of preliminaries this afternoon, it still looks like SC will pocket its 20th NCAA track title here tomorrow but the word is watch out for Kansas.

Field events will start at 1:30 p.m., the track showdowns at 2:30.

The Jayhawks matched the Trojans in number of qualifying spots earned today, six, and three of those were firsts. Host California was next with five.

The only Trojan to lead the parade today was Dave Davis in the shot-put.

His 58ft. 6½in. looks good for 10 solid points. Rink Babka ranks second in the discus behind Kansas' Olympic champ, Al Oerter.

Rink spun one 184ft. 7in. but Oerter came back to beat it with 186ft. 2in. Jack Egan may have trouble taking the expected third, as Jay Silvester of Utah State did 174ft. 7in. today to Egan's 169ft. 7½in. for fourth.

Bob Lawson qualified in two events, ranking fifth in the broad jump at 23ft. 11¼ in. but Ernie Shelby of Kansas is ahead at 24ft. 10¼in.

and Kent Floerke is second, 24ft. 5 1/2 in. Lawson's mark was 23ft. 11 1/2 in. Lawson also qualified, in fourth place, in the high hurdles but must still run a semifinal heat tomorrow.

Page Fifth

Mike Page was the Trojans' other qualifier. He stands fifth on the javelin list at 227ft. 1in.

The field eventers had four tries today and they hold up for the finals, when they get three more. The entire high jump and pole vault competition will be held tomorrow.

Trials were held in all the running events today except the mile and two-mile. The 100 and high hurdles have semis on tap tomorrow before the championships begin.

Two Aces

Troy, of course, still has Charley Dumas in the high jump and Maxie Truex in the two-mile. Dumas should take it all but Truex is in for a hot battle against Arizona State's Alex Henderson.

The two feature races tomorrow should be the mile and 440.

Cal's Don Bowden passed up the 880 today to concentrate on the four-lapper but Ron Delany of Villanova, with Villanova having a chance at team honors, went in the half and took his heat in 1:50.2. The mile opens the program tomorrow.

Hot Race

Even if Delany should pass up the 880 it should prove a great race. All the qualifiers were bunched today, with Tom Murphy of Manhattan copping one race in 1:50 flat and Jack Wilcox of Fresno State the other in 1:51.1, besides Delany. Ty Hadley, one of five Oxy qualifiers, got in third with 1:51.1 in Delany's heat.

The other Oxy representatives are Glen Johnson, fifth in the shot-put, 54ft. 8in., his best ever; Jon Jamison, seventh in the javelin, 221ft. 5in.; Clarence Treat, fourth in the high hurdles, and John Zetzman, third in the 440 semis at 47.6.

Favored Elias Gilbert of Winston-Salem withdrew from the championships after suffering a muscle pull in qualifying.
