

# Troy Rolls Up 80 to 50 Victory in Dual Meet

Potent SC, with Bobby Staten and Angie Coia wielding the bludgeon, not only beat California (80½ to 50½) but drubbed the Bears in their pet events yesterday afternoon at Occidental.

It was Troy's 82nd consecutive dual meet track victory without a loss and the 17th in a row over the Bears. In fact, California has only defeated SC once (1943) since 1924.

Cal didn't figure to win the meet but counted on sprinter - hurdler Willie White and quarter - miler Jack Yerman to come through in their specialties.

Staten and Coia would have none of this.

The fluid-moving Staten beat Yerman by two feet in a 47 flat quarter and then returned to whip White in the 220-yard low hurdles (23.5).

Although this was some feat, it was not entirely unexpected. It took Coia, the fleet footballer who has been plagued with injuries both on the gridiron and track, to provide the shocker.

Angie shifted gears in the final 10 yards of the century to photo out Willie at the wire in a rather slow 9.9. But the sprinters were bucking a slight head-wind.

White scratched from the furlong to concentrate on the lows and Coia was an easy victor in the former event at 21.7.

Over-shadowed but not un-noticed was Charlie Dumas' smashing double vic-

tory in the high jump and 120' highs. Dumas cleared 6ft. 8 in. and then broke Phil Cope's 23-year-old meet standard with a 14.2 clocking in the highs.

Dumas took three jumps at 6-11 in the high jump but was found wanting.

Staten tied a meet record originally set by SC's Jim Lea (1954) and equaled by Ted Smith (1958) with his time of 47. Lea and Smith had the benefit of one turn in their outings, while Staten went around two curves yesterday.

The loose San Diego stylist trailed Yerman until they were 15 yards from home. Bobby then drew abreast, ahead and actually eased off at the tape. Yerman, who placed third in the NCAA 440 last year, was caught in the same time.

It was another frustrating loss for Yerman, who bowed to Smith last year at Berkeley in the dual meet. Smith was far down the track yesterday, but there was Staten.

It wasn't exactly a joyous home-coming for White, the former Jefferson High and Harbor JC sensation. Willie, who boasts a victory over Bobby Morrow in the 100, couldn't redeem himself in the low hurdles.

He led Staten for the better part of the race but then lost his step and with it the lead, pulling up unplaced.

As for the other events, the Trojans came through in typical efficient fashion. Bob Shankland was impressive with a 4:08.6 mile victory (his best of the year) and he was followed home by SC's Atis Petersons (4:12.2).

Bill Jackson, who couldn't jump 23 ft. at this same pit last week against Oxy, won the broad jump with a season's topping mark of 24ft. 6 1/2 in.

Other Trojan winners were Marlin McKeever (55ft. 6 1/2 in., shot-put), Ernie Ballard (14ft. 4 in., pole vault) and Mike Page (213ft. 9 in., javelin).

The Bears' only victories came in the 880, discus and mile relay.
