

# Wiley's 25-6 Leap Tops Fine Marks at Mt. SAC

Although cold stuff which old-timers identified as rain fell intermittently, some outstanding performances brightened the closing program of the Mt. San Antonio Relays yesterday afternoon. However, no records tumbled.

Joel Wiley of Los Angeles State got off the best broad-jump of his career — 25ft. 6¼in. — and needed it to win the event. For Roy Range of the Striders weighed in with 25ft. 1in.

Ron Morris of the Striders, slipperiness notwithstanding, vaulted 14ft. 10in., finally besting UCLA's George Roubanis, who cleared 14ft. 7in.

Rink Babka, former SC whiz competing unattached, wafted the discus 189ft. 4in. to win in fast company that included Parry O'Brien (181-2½) and Rafer Johnson (169-1). Babka fouled on a fling of 192 feet.

Troy's two-mile relay quartet of Wayne Lemons, Ted Smith, Tom Anderson and Bob Shankland achieved a clocking of 7:31.8, good both for first place and a new school record. The former

campus mark was 7:32.5, set two years ago.

SC also took the mile baton race in 3:13.4, just one tick ahead of Occidental. Incidentally, Mike Larrabee of the third-place Striders turned in a 46.4 anchor lap.

Clarence Treat of Oxy skimmed the high hurdles in 14 flat to whip such nifties as Chuck Cobb, Ken Thompson, C. K. Yang, Bob Lawson, Billy Wells and Charlie Dumas. The latter pulled up half-way along the course after knocking down two barriers and banging into others.

On the other side of the coin was Adhemar da Silva of Brazil, former world record holder and two-time Olympic Games champion in the hop-step-jump. Perturbed by the runway and the rain, he fouled on his first two tries, then played it too safe on his third and failed even to qualify for the finals. Her-

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man Stokes proceeded to win this seldom-seen contest at 50 ft., a distance which Da Silva topped by several inches in a subsequent "consolation" effort.

Hal Connolly fell 10 ft. short of his world's record of 225ft. 4in. for the hammer throw and Max Truex, owner of the American record for the three-mile, won without seriously challenging his own mark. Little Maxie ground out a 13:59.5, as compared to his all-time best of 13:35.7.

Wiley was voted the field athlete of the carnival for his tremendous broad-jump, while track laurels went to Lt. Bill Dellinger of the Air Force, who established a new American citizen's record for two miles Friday night with a time of 8:48.2.
