

Long's Record

63-7 Put May

Go for Naught

Dallas Long twice bettered the world's shot-put record of 63ft. 2in. yesterday afternoon — but nothing, apparently, will come of it.

The 18-year-old Trojan giant pushed the ball 63ft. 2¼in. and 63ft. 7in. as SC and UCLA staged varsity and freshman track meets at Westwood. But each time, a gimmick bobbed up to thwart the amazing Trobabe weightman.

After Long got that 63-2¼ on his first toss, officials discovered that the toe board fronting the ring lacked half an inch of the required height of 4 in. That oversight was promptly remedied.

Seventh Try

But his 63-7 came on a seventh and last put, after which it was pointed out that while collegiate rules permit seven tries, only six are allowed in AAU and international competition.

Long's marks will be submitted for consideration, but probably won't even be accepted by the AAU as American records, let alone being sent along to the International Amateur Athletic Federation, which rules on world's records.

Record Pending

Being a freshie, Dallas can't qualify as a collegiate record-setter, either, so he'll have to settle simply for a national freshman mark.

However, the kid from Phoenix already has pending for recognition the 63-2 he achieved at the Santa Barbara Relays to equal Parry

O'Brien's official world mark. O'Brien, by the way, watched Long yesterday and congratulated him as the new champ—before the snafu developed.

Victory String

The Trojans made it 27 straight victories over the Bruins in the varsity half of the show, scoring 86½ points to 44. But the Brubabes came through with a 66-65 win.

Four meet records fell and another was equaled as fine performances generally materialized.

George Roubanis of UCLA bested his own vault mark by soaring 14ft. 10½in., while Charlie Dumas of SC tied the high-jump mark of 6ft. 9¼in. in varsity competition.

Long Stars

Long set two new frosh records, adding a discus throw of 161ft. 11in. to his 63ft. 7in. with the shot. And Bruce Munn of the Trobables sped the 220 in 20.8 for the other.

Dumas also won the high hurdles, as did Munn in the frosh 100. The day's other double winner was Bobby Staten of Troy, who took the varsity sprints.

The customers got a laugh to go with their thrills.

The inevitable dog suddenly appeared from nowhere to harass the varsity 220 contestants. First, he nipped at the heels of UCLA's Rich Johnson, then switched to Staten. Johnson kept going to win, but Staten took one look at his bare-fanged pursuer and high-tailed it off the track.

Doggone!

It was agreed to run the race over—without the dog. This time, Staten triumphed and Johnson had to settle for second.

Two distance events stole at least part of the show.

In the varsity mile, UCLA's Bob Holland upset SC's Bob Shankland by two-tenths in a desperate stretch

uel. And in the varsity 880, a blanket finish found Tom Anderson and Wayne Lemons of Troy finishing one-two, with John Seaman of UCLA third, just three-tenths off the pace.

The Bruins were blanked in the 440, javelin and low hurdles in addition to losing the mile relay. Thus, the Trojans amassed 32 points to zero in those four events alone.
