

Kansas Wins First NCAA Track Title

LINCOLN, Neb., June 15 (AP)—Kansas' Big Eight champions swept to their first team title and two meet records were shattered, another tied, in the 36th NCAA track meet today. One performance which bettered a world mark, and one which matched a world record were disallowed because of an aiding wind.

The closing event, the 230-*yd.* low hurdles, brought the most spectacular performance, a 22.5-*a.* victory by Hayes Jones of Eastern Michigan, the meet's only double winner.

Too Much Wind

However, this clocking which would have been a new world mark around a full curve, was disallowed because of a 5.248-m.p.h. wind.

Another brilliant effort, a 9.3-*a.* victory by Kansas' Charlie Tidwell in the 100-*yd.* dash which matched the world and meet record for the distance, was canceled because of a 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ -m.p.h. wind.

However, new meet records were fashioned in the 400-meter hurdles and hammer throw, and a meet mark was tied in the 120-yard high hurdles, won by Hayes Jones in 13.6.

Three Firsts

Kansas, rolling up 73 points, captured three firsts, but scored in nine events as the Jayhawks replaced ineligible Southern California as team champion.

Jones, the meet's top scorer with 20 points, proved a champion killer, dethroning Elias Gilbert of Winston-Salem in the high hurdles and Tidwell in the low hurdles.

Dick Howard of the University of New Mexico set a meet 400-meter hurdles record which occurred at the start of the meet and was not affected by the wind.

Howard, finishing 3 *yds.* ahead of Cliff Cushman of Kansas, was clocked in 50.6 seconds.

That bettered the former mark of 51.9 set by Notre Dame's Aubrey Lewis in 1958.

Howard, 6-ft. 165-pounder, took the lead after the first 100 *yds.* and won as he pleased as the NCAA under-carnival opened.

Second behind Kansas was San Jose State with 48.1 points, 18 of them coming when Ray Norton and Bob Poynter finished one-two in the 220-*yd.* dash.

Norton, who tied the world's record for the 100-*yd.* dash earlier in the season, was disqualified in the finals because of two false starts. He had led the way in yesterday's preliminaries, winning his heat in :09.5.

Norton grabbed his sweat suit, swung it wildly over his head and stalked around the south turn of the track, away from the starting line. As the race was run, he turned—and when the race was over, he flung himself on the trackside grass and flailed with his hands. He wouldn't talk to newsmen.

Houston, capturing first in the 3,000-meter steeplechase and hop-step-and-jump, was third with 38, followed by Oklahoma with 31, Oklahoma State with 22.1, Boston University with 20, and Eastern Michigan, also with 20, all scored by Jones.
