# O'Brien Flings Shot 64 ft. 1/2 in.

The greatest shot-putting sequence in track-field history materialized in the SPAAU championships at Mt. San Antonio yesterday afternoon.

Parry O'Brien, holder of the recognized world rec-

ord of 63ft. 2in., made five throws ranging from 62ft. 2 1/2 in. to 63ft. 1 1/2 in. He fouled on his other effort.

Following the official competition, Parry really waxed warm, doing 63-9/8 and 64-0 1/8.

His sequence yesterday: 63-1 1/4, foul, 62-11 1/8, 62-3 1/8, 62-2 1/4, 62-7 1/4.

The champ's next competition comes in the National AAU meet at Boulder, Colo., Friday and Saturday—and the former SC strong man appears ready to shatter his world record, which Dallas Long equaled this season. Long was not among those present at Mt. SAC yesterday, but will join O'Brien in tossing for the Striders at Boulder.

Wotta one-two punch! O'Brien broke his own meet record of 62ft. 3 1/4in., which he set last year.

### Records Fall

Three other meet marks fell, and another was equaled.

Jerome Walters galloped 800 meters in 1:49.4 to eclipse the 1:50.3 achieved by Bob Seaman of UCLA in 1956. Hal Connolly swung the hammer 22ft. 8 1/4in., easily surpassing the record of 164ft. 3in. established by Ed Flannagan in 1932. Herm Stokes did 51ft. 10in. in the hop-step-jump, thus putting into the discard Al Andrews' 1957 performance of 50ft. 4 1/2 in.

All three record-setters represented the Striders.

### Gordien Competes

The long-standing 100 meters record of 10.4 was equaled by Willie Williams, former Compton High speedster now a freshman at San Jose State. The record was set in 1921 by the late Charley Paddock and tied in 1932 by Frank Wykoff, both when they wore SC regalia.

A non-winner drew perhaps the most cheers from the smallish crowd.

Fortune Gordien, world record-holder in the discus, came out of retirement to take second place in the event. Out of competition since the 1956 Olympic

Games, Gordien spun the platter 177ft. 4in. Rink Babka won at 180ft. 11 1/2 in.

Mike Larrabee, former Trojan representing the Striders, scored a double by
