

DAVIS SHOT WINNER (62-8½); CONNOLLY CLOSE TO RECORD

One national college record fell, a world mark was closely approached and two surprise winners emerged yesterday as the Mt. San Antonio relays came to an

end in weather better suited for a Winter Olympics encore.

SC's fleet foursome of Stan Rhodes, Ted Eggleston, Kevin Hogan and Rex Cawley broke the national freshman mile relay standard with a 3:13.7 clocking. What's more, second-place Occidental did 3:14.4 to equal the old standard set by Texas in 1956.

Hal Connolly hurled the hammer 225 ft., just four in,

shy of his own world record.

The eagerly awaited shot-put free-for-all involving Dallas Long, Parry O'Brien and Dave Davis was short on distance but long on upset. Dave, generally regarded as low man on the "big four" totem pole, won with 62 ft. 8½ in., best "legitimate" effort of his career.

Hot Discus Field

O'Brien, who owns the official world mark of 63 ft. 4 in., had to settle for 61 ft. 7¼ in. and Long finished third at 61 ft. 2¾ in. It was Davis' first victory over O'Brien in 13 meetings and only his second over Long in 14.

Bill Nieder's 63 ft. 10¼ in. at the Kansas Relays yesterday was announced as the Mt. Sac competition got underway, but failed to rouse the California behemoths to heights. All complained that the wind bothered them.

The discus event was a dilly, with sophomore Jim Wade of SC getting off an effort of 190 ft. 6½ in., best in the nation this year, to fool the dopesters.

It was a hot number, eight

men surpassing the Olympic Games qualifying requirement of 173ft. 10½in. Favored Rink Babka was second with 188-10, while 'way down in eighth place was O'Brien despite a creditable toss of 174-11½.

Ron Morris, after winning the vault with an ascension of 15ft. 4in., ordered the bar up to 15ft. 10¼in. for a world record try. But it was no go.

heels to the 100-meter field with a windblown 10.2 while the mile went to Bill Dellinger, whose well-known creak eased him into the wire about a foot ahead of Laszlo Taborn in 4:07.7.

Warming up for the defense of his national decathlon championship and the Olympics, in which he'll represent the Republic of China, UCLA freshman C. K. Yang would up that two-day competition with 7,892 points, his lifetime best and the sixth highest total ever recorded.

However, Dave Edstrom of Oregon recently uncorked an 8,173 performance.

In addition to running anchor on the victorious Trobabe relay team, Cawley evened his score with Dickie Howard, NCAA and national AAU 400-meter hurdles champion, by winning the event yesterday in 52.2. Howard, complaining that the polar blast threw him off stride, was second in 54.1. Cawley had finished fifth to Howard in the nationals last summer.

Charlie Dumas heard an announcement that John

Thomas had high jumped 7ft. 3/2 in. back East yesterday, but the 'Trojan gear couldn't do better than 6ft. 9 3/4 in.

Another "best of the year" nationally materialized in the hop-step-jump, where Ken Flockerke bounced 50ft. 6 1/2 in.

Altogether, ten meet records succumbed, making it a very successful affair despite the unkindly weather. Some 9,000 hardy fans showed up and stayed put.

Chosen the outstanding performers were Connoly in field events and Lew Stiegelitz, who won the 10,000-

meter marathon Friday night, got the track award.
