

Oxy's Smith Nips Norton in 9.4 Dash

FRESNO, May 14 — Ray J. Norton's reign over the sprinters, which had resulted in 29 consecutive victories, was ended in the West Coast Relays here tonight by Doug Smith of Occidental.

The bespectacled Oxy senior, who has been getting tougher with every start this Olympics year, lunged to victory in the 100-yd. dash finals as both were clocked in 9.4.

Norton last had lost almost a year ago when Oregon's Roscoe Cook won in 9.3 at Modesto's California Relays.

Allowable Wind

Smith and Norton won their heats tonight in wind-aided 9.4s, but the machine recorded only a 2.8 m.p.h. boost in the finals, well beneath the allowable limit of 4.47.

Norton got off slightly better, but they ran as a team almost all the way and a dead heat appeared likely until Smitty edged ahead in the last stride.

"This is the greatest moment of my life," he said afterward, "but one race doesn't make a champion." He had done two previous 9.4s this season, both wind-blown, though.

"I had two teeth pulled early this week," Norton revealed, "and one was a wisdom tooth and they had to take stitches so I missed some practice. I feel good now, though, so it's no alibi. I just got beat."

New American and inter-collegiate records were set in the distance medley relay as Santa Clara Valley Youth Village, with Laszlo Tabori running a 3:59.6 mile leg, was clocked in 9:34.9

and second-place Stanford
9:40.6.

Tabori ran away from Ernie Cunliffe in the anchor leg as the latter settled for 4:04.5. Hal Gordon, Mike Peake and Jim Beatty were the other Santa Clara runners.

There is no world record for the event, but the best previous time was 9:42 by the Striders in 1957. And the previous intercollegiate standard was 9:42.3, by California in 1957.

Dave Davis, making a last-minute decision to compete, captured the shot put with a toss of 61ft. 7 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. Dallas Long was second with 61ft. 7in. Neither Bill Nieder nor Parry O'Brien participated.

Three other national records fell during the lengthy program.

The SC quartet of Stan Rhodes, Ted Eggleston, Kevin Hogan and Rex Cawley set a new college freshman mile relay mark of 3:12 as a follow-up to the 3:13.3 it did at the recent Mt. San Antonio Relays, a performance pending for recognition.

Cawley contributed a 45.6 anchor leg.

National junior college records were topped when Harry Edwards of Fresno threw the discus 171ft. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., and Bakersfield ran the 440 relay in 41 flat.

A number of other fine marks ensued.

J. D. Martin of Oklahoma and Ron Morris of the Striders tied for first in the pole vault at 15ft. 3in., and thereby erased a famous name from the meet record book—Cornelius Warmerdam, whose 15-2 had stood since 1942.

Oregon State's Gary Stenlund got off the nation's second best javelin sling of the year when he did 260ft. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. Bill Alley of Kansas is tops with 260-11.

Jaycee 9.4

After winning the high jump at 6ft. 10in., Charlie Dumas of SC tried for a world record of 7ft. 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ in., but failed. Darrell Horn of Oregon State broad-jumped 25ft. 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., but beat Joel Wiley of the Striders by only half an inch.

Another 9.4 materialized in a junior college heat of the 100, being accomplished by Dennis Johnson, Bakersfield sophomore from Jamaica. This one, too, was wind-blown. And in the finals, Johnson pulled up lame.
