BERKELEY, June 17-All is not yet lost, but unless it rains miracles here tomorrow SC will not waltz off with its 21st NCAA track and field championship at Edwards Stadium.

The Trojans did a veritable one-hoss-shay collapse in the preliminaries this afternoon, leaving defending champion Kansas sitting pretty, indeed.

Dallas Long, as expected, came through with a 61ft. 9in. shot-put to topple the meet record and take almost a 4ft. lead over the field


