

OREGON WHIPPED BY SC, 73 TO 58

Stanford Also Bows in Track Meet; Troy's Cawley Runs 440 in 46.3, Wins Lows

STANFORD STADIUM. People who call tall men "shorty" and fat men "slim" must be tickled over the outcome of Saturday's SC-Oregon-Stanford trackfest here.

University of Oregon sports team bears the nickname "Ducks" or "Web-foots" — but the run-jump-throw squad coach Bill Bowerman brought down couldn't take advantage of waterfowl weather to upset SC or even come close.

Course Heavy

Competing on a cinder course that was heavy and grass runways that were soft from heavy rain Friday, not to mention intermittent showers and cold breezes Saturday that further hampered the athletes, the Trojans breezed to a triple victory.

In the triangular scoring, it was 83½ for SC, 61 for Oregon and 17½ for Stanford.

In the simultaneous dual meets, SC beat Oregon, 73-58, and Stanford, 104-25. Oregon bested the Indians, 90-38.

As anticipated, the stars of the show were Troy's Rex Cawley and the Duck's Dyrol Burleson.

Cawley ripped off a 46.3 quarter, remarkable time under the circumstances, also won the low hurdles as he toyed with the opposition and finally ran anchor on the winning mile relay foursome.

Hits Soft Spot

Two weeks ago, Rex did a 46.2, fastest in the nation. Saturday, he wobbled on the last turn as he hit a mushy spot and finished with caked spikes, yet was only a tick slower.

Burleson captured the 330 and mile. After loafing to a 4:11.5 clocking in the four-lapper, Dyrol turned on the gas in the half and ran the distance in 1:50.3, second best time in the nation this year.

Burleson also owns the best—1:50—which he shares with Pete Close of the U.S. Marines.

It was give-and-take in

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the sprints. Oregon's Harry Jerome took the 100 over SC's Jim Bates and Bruce Munn in 9.6, but Munn retaliated by winning the 220 in 21.5, with Bates second and Jerome third. Roscoe Cook of the Ducks finished fourth both times.

The same sort of seesawing took place in the hurdles. Oregon's Jerry Tarr upset SC's Bob Pierce in the highs as he did 14 flat, a real good job, but Tarr wound up behind both Cawley (28.4) and Pierce in the lows.

Stanford rooters in the hardy crowd of 8,500 got about their only chance to cheer in the discus throw. Here, Dave Weill won with a spin of 175 ft., which not only vanquished the favorite, Jim Wade of the Trojans, but broke the school record of 173-6 set by Fred Peters in 1957.

Wade's best effort was 173-0½.

Long Gets Cheers

Dallas Long got perhaps the afternoon's two biggest cheers — first, when he opened the shotput competition with a typical heave of 63-9, which stood up; second, when he led off in the weightmen's relay, which ended the program on a comic note.

Dallas ran like a fellow leaning back in a rocking chair. And as he passed the baton, the 260-lb. grinning giant stumbled and sprawled on the cinders.
