

# UCLA'S DUNKELL RUNS 1:48.9 880

## Bruin Soph's Time Fastest in United States; Trojans Capture Quadrangular Track Meet

Andy Dunkell, 19-year-old UCLA sophomore from Fairfax High, tossed a bombshell into Friday night's quadrangular track meet at Occidental by scoring a huge upset in the 880.

There was nothing flukey about it, that's for sure.

The bespectacled athlete was clocked in 1:48.9, fastest time in the country this year and possibly the world. In the process, Dunkell defeated such good ones as Jim Cerveny of Oxy, the national AAU champion, Warren Farlow of SC, and Mel Spence of Arizona State.

### Cerveny Sets Pace

Dunkell, whose previous best for the distance was 1:54.2, let Cerveny set the pace, but trailed him closely and roared ahead in the last 300. Farlow finished second in 1:49.4, fastest in SC history with Spence third at 1:50.5 and Cerveny a fading fourth at 1:51.5.

The race was all the more remarkable because of the cold weather, which not only handicapped most of the performers, but held attendance to an estimated 3,500.

As anticipated, the Trojans easily captured team honors with 61 $\frac{2}{3}$  points. UCLA was second with 39, Arizona St. next with 32 $\frac{2}{3}$  and Oxy last with 30 $\frac{2}{3}$ .

Prior to Dunkell's great performance, the best 880 in the United States this year was a 1:49.6 by Jerry Siebert, former University of California runner and a member of the 1960 Olympic team.

Andy's victory was a reward of perseverance. As a prep senior, he came down with a strep throat just before the City meet and was unable to compete. And that, of course, kept him out of the State championships, too. As a Bruin frosh last year, he suffered a broken bone in his

leg and was sidelined most of the spring.

Another large upset materialized when Walt Maxwell of UCLA withstood a closing rush by Oxy's Bill Peck to win the two-mile run. Peck, whose best is 9:15.6, was off form and couldn't quite match Maxwell's 9:31.6.

Dunkell was voted the track athlete of the meet, while field honors went to SC's Dallas Long, who won the shot at 64ft. 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. and took third in the discus at 172-3 $\frac{1}{2}$ , his best ever for the platter event.

Bob Pierce of SC scored the evening's only double by taking both hurdle races, the

highs in 14.2 and the lows in 22.8. The latter clocking broke the Patterson Field record of 23 flat set earlier this year by Troy's Rex Cawley, who didn't compete Friday because of a leg injury.
