Bruin Soph's Time Fastest in United States: Trojans Capture Quadrangular Track Meet

Andy Dunkell, 19-year-old UCLA sophomore from Fairfax High, tossed a bombshell into Friday night's quadrangular track meet at Occidental by scoring a huge upset in the 880.

Dunkell, whose previous best for the distance was 1:54.2, let Cerveny set the pace, but trailed him closely and roared ahead in the last 300. Farlow finished second in 1:49.4, fastest in SC history with Spence third at 1:50:5 and Cerveny a fading fourth at 1:51.5.

The race was all the more remarkable because of the cold weather, which not only handicapped most of the performers, but held attendance to an estimated 3,500.

As anticipated, the Trojans easily captured team honors with 613/3 points. UCLA was second with 39 Arizona St. next with 3235 and Oxy last with 30%.

Prior to Dunkell's great performance, the best 880 in the United States this year was a 1:49.6 by Jerry Siebert, former University of California runner and a member of the 1960 Olympic team.
