

Marks Fall in Mt. SAC Relay Meet

Dave Tork did it.

The 27-year-old Marine lieutenant from Camp Pendleton, who finished second at Santa Barbara recently when John Uelses set a world pole vault record of 16 ft. $\frac{3}{4}$ in., got even Saturday in the fourth annual Mt. San Antonio Relays.

Tork scaled 16-2 to junk Uelses' mark before it ever had a chance to become official.

The quiet but confident athlete then ordered the bar elevated to 16-5, but failed to fly over at that dizzying altitude.

Dave's record vault, which came on his second try at the height, was viewed by only a small remnant of the crowd, for it didn't happen until 6:15 p.m., long after everything else was over.

However, three very important people were in the

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stands—Tork's wife and two small daughters. He bounced up from the sawdust as the bar still jiggled and reached over to kiss and embrace his family.

Two other vaulters, George Davies of Arizona State, whose 15-10 $\frac{1}{4}$ of last year still is the recognized world mark, and Gerald Pratt, former Dorsey High and Los Angeles City College boy now enrolled at Texas Southern, still were in the hunt at 16-2, but failed after Tork had succeeded.

Tork Passed

Though the event got under way at 1 o'clock with 22 entries, Tork passed until the bar reached 15 feet. He

cleared it on his first try, went over again on his first try at 15-7, and was well over on his first try at 16-2 only to knock off the bar coming down.

The new champion was only an 11-9 vaulter in high school and at West Virginia U. his best was 14 $\frac{1}{2}$. Entering the Marines in 1958 he remained pretty much of a vaulting nobody until this year, when he cleared 15-8 $\frac{1}{4}$ the day Uelses became the first ever to do 16 feet outdoors.

The greatest discus free-for-all of all time also materialized.

Out of it came the second longest throw in history, an effort of 198ft. 6in. by big Al Oerter, two-time Olympic Games champion, who was representing the New York Athletic Club.

Oerter needed a big one to win, for world record holder Jay Silvester (199-2 $\frac{1}{2}$) uncorked a 195-7 throw.

The day's program also produced the fourth mile under four minutes by an American when Jim Grelle of the Los Angeles Track Club zipped to a 3:59.9 clocking.

Oerter and Grelle (while the pole vault was still in

progress) were voted the meet's two top performers. Several others likewise came through with superlative performances before the pop-eyed throng of 10,000.

Records fell like stock market prices.

Arizona State set a new national collegiate mark of 3:07.5 in the mile relay — and this despite one very bad pass of the baton. Ray Van Asten of Mt. SAC lowered his own national junior college 880 standard to 1:48.6.

Thirteen meet records tumbled Saturday and another was equalled.

Ullis Williams, Arizona State freshman from Compton, was another who enjoyed a large day. He won the 440 in 46 flat, equalling the best time in the country this year, and then blazed to a 45.9 as anchor man on that record mile relay combine.

Oerter, 25-year-old Kansas alumnus, went into action against all-star competition with a lifetime best of 194-1 $\frac{1}{2}$. He proceeded to do 190, 190-8 and 188-8. Then he fouled, but came right back with that 198-6 and finished with another 190 for an amazing series.

His happiness was abruptly halted upon discovering that somebody had swiped his discus while he was accepting a trophy on the victory stand.

Second to Elliott

Grelle, paced for two laps by Bill Kozar, but totally without company thereafter, turned his sub-4 trick with quarters of 58.5, 60.5, 61.8 and 59.1.

His best previous time was 4:00.1, behind the great Herb Elliott at the Compton Invitational of 1960.

Only Americans to do better are Dyrol Burleson with 3:57.6; Jim Beatty, with 3:58 and Don Bowden with 3:58.7.
