

ONLY 1,284 FANS ON HAND TO SEE USC WIN BIG 5 MEET

As anticipated, USC won the Big Five Track and Field championship for the third straight year at the Coliseum Saturday. Not as anticipated, UCLA came within six points of perpetrating a mammoth upset.

The Trojans scored 78½ points. The surprising Bruins, picking up scores in all 16 events, aggregated 73. Stanford was third with 50, California fourth with 21½ and Washington fifth with 17.

Tiny Turnout

The televised program attracted only 1,284 on-the-spot viewers.

Eight meet records tumbled. Another was set as the low hurdles were run around a turn for the first time.

Troy's Dallas Long, who had broken the world's shot put record in the Coliseum Relays just eight days earlier with a 65ft 10½in. performance, found the same course a little tougher Saturday. His top toss measured "only" 63-7¼, but it was good enough to better his own meet mark.

High Scorers

Arnold Tripp and C. K. Yang, both of UCLA, wound up the big men of the afternoon.

Tripp won the 100 in 9.6 and the 220 in 21 flat (both clockings established new meet records), took fourth in the broad jump and ran a leg on the second place Bruin mile relay team.

Yang was second in both hurdles races, second in the javelin, and fourth in the vault for a grand total of 14 points. Tripp's aggregate was 13.

Only other double winner was USC's Rex Cawley. He bettered the 440 record with a time of 46.8, set a low hurdles mark of 23.3 and anchored the victorious relay combine.

The Trojans were weak-

ened by the absence of injured Bruce Munn, who captured both sprints last year, and the failure of Bob Pierce, another double victor in the 1961 meet, to provide any help Saturday. Returning to competition for the first time since hurting his knee several weeks ago, Pierce did not defend in the low hurdles and finished out of the money in the highs.
