

LONG SETS MARK IN NCAA SHOT--64-7

**Budd Fails to Qualify in 220; Favored
Oregon Sets Pace; USC Half Milers Fade**

EUGENE—One meet record was broken and two were tied Friday as the NCAA track and field championships got off to a spectacular start before 8,100 spectators at Hayward Field.

Except for the 3-mile, which Pat Clohessy of Houston won for the second straight year, the day was devoted to qualifying performances.

The major upset came in the 220-yd. semifinals where Frank Budd, defending champion from Villanova, finished fifth and failed to qualify for the finals today.

University of Southern

California's blond giant, Dallas Long, posted the lone new record of the day when he hoisted the shot out 64ft. 7in. to better his own mark of 63ft. 3½in. posted a year ago at Philadelphia.

Budd tied Bobby Morrow's NCAA record of 9.3 in the first heat of the 100 and Harry Jerome, his chief rival in the short sprint today, twice tied the furlong mark of 20.7 around the turn and didn't extend himself either time.

Although Budd's demise in the 220 came as a surprise, it was not entirely unheralded. The holder of the world

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record for the 100, and a double winner in the sprints in 1961 had developed a groin injury at the Compton Invitational two weeks ago.

"I'm simply not in condition," he said, and he showed it in the preliminaries of the furlong as well as in the semifinals where Jerome, Nate Adams of Purdue, Roger Sayers, Omaha, and Steve Haas of Occidental ran past him on the rush to the tape.

As anticipated, Oregon set the qualifying pace earning nine positions for the finals against five for USC, and four each for Stanford, Villanova and San Jose State.

The defending championship Trojan squad also suffered a mild upset elimination. It came in the high hurdles where Bob Pierce, who finished second in this race a year ago but has been hampered by an injured leg this season, ran a bad eighth in his 120-yd heat.

Coach Jess Hill's half-milers got wiped out in the semifinals after all four had passed their tests in the preliminaries.

Bold Start

Rex Cawley of USC made a bold start in quest of a double today in two of the toughest events of the meet by qualifying for the finals in both the 440-yd. dash and

the quarter mile hurdles. Even if he gets 20 points it hardly would help the Trojan cause enough to forestall the favored Webfoots who are loaded in the mile and two-mile.

Among the opening day's sterling performers were Oregon's Jerry Tarr, a stand-out favorite to repeat his 1961 victory in the high barriers and a threat in the 440-yd. hurdles; and Mel Renfro, great sophomore at Oregon. Tarr ran the highs in 13.6 but an aiding wind prevented him from getting credit for a record tie.

Renfro could run second to his teammate Tarr in the highs, and is only an inch and a quarter back of Tony Watson, Oklahoma, in the broad jump. Renfro jumped a foot better than his best ever with a 25-ft. 11 1/4 in. leap compared to Watson's 26 ft. 1/2 in. All seven broad jump qualifiers were over 25 ft.

Kermit Alexander of UCLA became the surprise leader in the hop, step and jump with a mark of 50 ft. 11 1/4 in.

This was three feet farther than the Bruin grid star had gone before.

Strong 3rd

It was Australia and England one, two in the 3-mile race, with Brian Turner of Southern Illinois, a Britisher, finishing second to the Aussie, Clohessy, who was clocked in 13:51.6, four seconds slower than his NCAA mark made last year.

Dale Story, the former Orange High and Santa Ana College star running for Oregon State, gave Clohessy a stiff battle all the way down the back stretch of the final lap.

In doing so he ran out of gas and Turner picked him off 50-yd. from the tape. Clohessy's final quarter was run in 56.3. Turner was clocked in 13:53.9 and Story's time was 13:58.

Today's finals in 16 events will be seen in Los Angeles over KTTV Channel 11, from 2:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. with Bill Welsh and Dick Bank reporting.
