

Canadian Youth Sets New American Mark

Bruce Kidd did it again.

The 18-year-old University of Toronto freshman won the 5,000-meter run for the second year in a row at the Compton Invitational track and field carnival Saturday night.

And how he won it.

The youngster not only defeated Olympians Max Truex and Murray Halberg but set American records for that distance and the slightly shorter three-mile course en route.

Kidd's clockings were 13:17.4 and 13:43.8, as compared to the existing marks of 13:21, held by Truex, and 13:51.8, held by Jim Beatty.

Halberg Set Pace

Halberg, who owns the world 2-mile and 3-mile marks, set the early pace, but Kidd surged past with three laps to go and won by 40 yd. Truex also passed the fading New Zealander with one lap left.

A world record almost went kerplunk in the night's closing event, the mile relay.

Arizona State fled the distance in 3:05.7, just one-tenth slower than the standard set by a combine of United States Olympians. Mike Barrick ran 47.7, Henry Carr 45.7, Ron Freeman 46.6 and Ulis Williams, 45.7.

Ulis Williams, Compton boy now attending Arizona State, ran the year's fastest 440 in the United States as he did 45.9.

Shot Put Series

Dallas Long defeated Gary Gubner in the shot, 64-11½ to 63-9¾, and Jay Silvester approached his world discus record of 199-2½ by whirling the platter an even 199. Al Oerter has a pending record of 200-5½, however.

Long and Gubner both came through with great shot series, all six of Dallas' efforts measuring 61-9½ or

more and all six of Gary's going at least 61-8¼.

Long's puts in order, were 62-11½, 64-11½, 61-9½, 63-5, 64-8¾ and 63-3½.

Thus, the big USC senior five times broke the meet record of 62-8¼ set by Parry O'Brien in 1960.

Contention in the discus throw went four deep as Stanford's Dave Weill did 191-7½ behind Silvester for a new intercollegiate record, followed by Rink Babka with 191-2½ and Bob Humphreys with 190-0½.

With Jim Beatty scratching because of a leg injury and Jim Grelle dropping out during the race, mile honors went to Cary Weisiger, whose timing was 4:02.3. Weisiger barely beat out Bob Seaman in a tight stretch duel.

Biggest surprise of the program came in the pole vault, where Dave York, who has a pending world record of 16-2, couldn't clear 15ft. George Davies, Ron Morris, John Rose and Gerald Pratt all cleared 15-6¼ to give the oldest meet record a four-way pasting.

Way back in 1941 Cornelius Warmerdam did 15-5¾ and it stood up until Saturday.

Long Heave

Jan Sikorsky of USC registered the second longest javelin throw in the country this year and his own all-time best of 261-3½. However, he did not disturb the meet mark, for it was at Compton in 1959 that Al Cantello set a world record of 282-3½, which since has been eclipsed.

Villanova's flying Frank Budd, who set a world 100-yd. record of 9.2 last year, won that event in 9.4 Saturday, then came back to take the 220, too, in 21 flat.
