

HOYT, TROJAN SOPH, LEAPS 7-1/2; YANG VAULTS 15-10 1/2

Summer weather produced summer performances — and then some — as UCLA and USC clashed in their annual relays meet at Westwood Saturday forenoon. It was the first outdoor competition of the year for both squads.

C. K. Yang, the Bruins' one-man track team, bettered the national collegiate pole vault record by clearing 15ft. 10 1/2 in.

Lew Hoyt, Trojan sophomore, became the seventh American to high jump 7ft. And he did it with half an inch to spare.

Meet Records Fall

USC senior Bob Pierce skimmed the 120-yd. high hurdles in 14 flat, while Larry Stuart, newly transferred from Santa Ana JC to Troy, whipped the javelin 239ft. 5 1/2 in.

Altogether, eight meet records tumbled and two others were equaled.

Yang vaulted 16-3 1/4 indoors recently for an all-time high that soon was eclipsed by Finland's Pentti Nikula's 16-8 3/4, but C. K. never before had done more than 14-6 3/4 outdoors.

Tough Competition

He encountered tough competition Saturday as Mel Hein Jr. and Mike Flanagan, both of USC, went over at 15-4 1/2.

Yang easily broke the UCLA record of 15-1, set by George Roubanis in 1958, and the Trojan pair got the consolation of exceeding Jim Brewer's USC mark of 15-4. They won't get credit for it, though, because school records must come on winning performances. Hein's previous best was 15-1, Flanagan's 14-11 3/4.

Hoyt, missing twice at 6-10 1/2 and twice more at 7-0 1/2 before achieving the big one, jiggled the bar slightly as the crowd of 2,000 momentarily froze, then erupted in a great ovation.

His best previous leaps were 6-10 outdoors and 6-10-3/4 indoors. He replaces Char-

lie Dumas as Trojan record-holder, the latter having cleared 7-0 1/4 in 1960.

John Thomas, Joe Faust, Bob Avant, Bob Gardner and Gene Johnson are the other U.S. citizens in the 7-ft. category.

Yang, by the way, is 29, Hoyt only 19.

C. K. put in a busy day, competing in six events. In addition to winning the pole vault, he won the broad jump at 23-1 3/4, was second in the javelin at 229-5 1/2, fourth in the high jump at 6-4, fifth in the discus at 131-8 and sixth in the shot at 45-4 1/2.

There was no scoring, but USC captured nine of the 13 events.

SAN JOSE (AP) — San Jose State won nine running events — seven with sophomores — in a non-scoring season opening track meet Saturday against the Santa Clara Valley Youth League.

Top Spartan performances came from Ben Tucker, who won the mile in 4:09.3; sophomore Mike Gibeau, winner of the 880 in 1:51.6, and soph Dwight Middleton, 220 victor in 20.8.

Jeff Chase vaulted 15-6 to top San Jose field men. Pete Danna led the Spartans' opposition with a triple jump of 51-2 3/4.
