

# C.K. Yang Escapes Serious Injury, Then Vaults 16-1

FRESNO — UCLA's C. K. Yang went from near tragedy to near triumph at the West Coast Relays Saturday. While practicing for the pole vault, the Bruin senior bounced off the landing pad and struck his back on the base of the vaulting standard. He had to be helped from the field.

But Yang, who recently broke the world decathlon record, came back to clear 16 ft. 1 in. However, Ron Morris of the Striders likewise got over at that height and was ruled the winner of the event on fewer misses. Both tried vainly to do 16-4.

No world, national or intercollegiate records had fallen, but a mess of meet marks were bettered.

### Wind Aided

In the open class, records were set in the discus, javelin, 2-mile relay, vault and 880 relay. The record for the distance medley relay was equaled.

Mahoney Samuels of Foothill junior college, who reportedly will follow coach Vern Wolfe to USC next year, bettered the American record for the triple jump, only to have an aiding wind nullify his performance.

Samuels did 54 ft. 5 1/4 in., as compared to the American mark of 53-10 set by Ira Davis of the United States Olympic team in 1960. But he was boosted along by a 7 m.p.h. breeze, more than the allowable limit.

### Duel Fizzles

Danny Murphy, 19-year-old San Jose State sophomore from Mira Costa High, captured the 5,000-meter run in 14:34.5. Murphy, who weighs only 130 and has ulcer trouble, had no problem once he decided to let out after a slow-paced start.

The expected discus duel between Rink Babka and Bob Humphreys of the Pasadena Athletic Assn. failed to materialize when the for-

mer stayed home. And Humphreys, winner of the Pan-American games title, had to settle for third behind Jay Silvester of Trementon, Utah, and Dave Weill of Stanford. Silvester threw 194-11 1/2 to smash his own meet mark of 190-2 1/4 set last year.

Danny Driskill of the Westmont Track Club won the 440-yd. hurdles in 52.2. Both Willie Atterberry of the Los Angeles Track Club and Rex Cawley of USC scratched.

Blaine Lindgren, former Utah athlete now representing the Pasadena AA, celebrated his recent triumph in the Pan-American high hurdles by edging Ralph Boston of the Striders. Lindgren was clocked in 13.9, Boston in 14 flat.
