

# USC's Cawley Sets U.S. 440 Hurdle Mark: 49.6

ALBUQUERQUE — One recognized world's record was broken, another tied, and an American mark was washed out in University Stadium here this warm Saturday night as Southern California walked away with its 22nd NCAA championship.

Brian Sternberg, blond Washington sophomore, pole vaulted 16 ft. 4 $\frac{3}{4}$  in., and narrowly missed 16 ft. 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ .

Henry Carr, Arizona State speedster, tied the fastest ever for one turn in the 220-yd. dash at 20.5. Both have better marks.

Then Rex Cawley of USC, running his sixth race in three days, turned in a 49.6 performance to shatter the American record for the 440-yd. hurdles after taking a second in the quarter.

The Trojans, with four firsts and a second along the way, made a runaway of the meet, scoring 61 points with Stanford an unexpected second with 42.

### Oregon 3rd

Oregon, defending champion, finished third with 41.

Sternberg posted a superior mark of 16ft. 8in. at Compton a week ago and Carr had a searing 20.3 earlier this season.

For Cawley, a senior at USC, this was his first NCAA title as he bettered Glenn Davis' record by three-tenths of a second and turned in one of the best hurdle races ever for that distance.

Remarkable as Cawley's performance was, it was overshadowed by his little teammate, Julio (Bean) Marin.

The USC pre-med student from Costa Rica, ran fourth in the steeplechase Saturday night after successive victories the previous two nights in the 6 and 3 mile races to collect 24 of his victorious team's points.

### Other First

The other first place for coach Vern Wolfe's Trojans came when Lew Hoyt won the high jump at 6 ft. 9 $\frac{1}{4}$  in.

In addition to the USC, Stanford one-two finish, other California teams made a fine showing.

San Jose State finished 7th with 21 points; Occidental eighth with 18 and California 11th with 15.

As expected, Ullis Williams of Arizona State ran to an easy victory in the 440-yd. dash in 45.8, a split off the meet mark. USC's Cawley, seeing he could not catch the former Compton star, eased

off at the end but saved second to be clocked in 46.1.

Coming through on his last toss, Gary Gubner, New York U. strong boy, edged out Oregon's Dave Steen in the shot with a heave of 62 ft. 5 in. The Webfoot weight man's best was 61 ft. 11 in. Occidental's John McGrath, in third, had a toss of 59 ft. 2 1/2 in.

A disqualification marred the mile run when Tom O'Hara of Loyola (Chicago), the apparent winner in 4:04.8, was thrown out for crossing over too soon after the start, giving the victory to Morgan Groth, Oregon State. He was clocked in 4:05.3, finishing three strides back of O'Hara.

## Weill Repeats

After a view of the finish photo Larry Questad of Stanford was awarded an upset victory in a tight finish over Henry Carr of Arizona State, and Nate Adams, Purdue. All were clocked in 9.7 running into a hampering breeze. Dave Morris of USC was fifth, clocked at 9.8.

Dave Weill of Stanford was the only defending champion to repeat Saturday night, when he won the discus throw with a flip of 181 ft.

2 1/2 in. McGrath got Oxy two points here with his 169 ft. 5 1/2 in. effort for fifth.

Robert Green of Southern Illinois inched out a victory over Stanford's Steve Cortright and Brian Polkinghorne of USC, in 14.1 for the high barriers. The two Californians were clocked one-tenth back. C. K. Yang of UCLA had to settle for fifth.
