

# Trojan Sweeps Too Much for Oregon, 82-63

The weather was Oregon's but not the track meet.

Triggered by the upset victories of Larry Stuart and Lew Hoyt, who competed with bandaged bad legs, USC's powerhouse Trojans remained undefeated by whipping the Webfoots at the Coliseum Saturday afternoon, 82-63.

Dark clouds and cold winds contributed to generally commonplace performances and a disappointing turnout of only 3,762 for this clash of collegiate giants.

## Tipton Slips

Hoyt high-jumped 6 ft. 8 in. to beat the favored Oregon pair of Paul Stuber and Terry Llewellyn. Stuber likewise cleared 6-8 but had to settle for second place on the fewer-missed gimmick, while Llewellyn finished out of the money, as did Troy's other gimpy jumper, Joe Faust.

Stuart flipped the javelin 241 ft. 11 in. for one of the day's three new meet records. Actually, it was more a case of Les Tipton losing than Stuart winning. A week ago, the Oregonian did 263-1 1/2, best in campus ranks this year. His top effort Saturday measured 240-5 1/2.

## Others Fall Aside

Some of Vern Wolfe's other cripples didn't fare so well.

Triple jumper Mahoney Samuels couldn't participate at all. Gary Comer skipped both relays and failed to score in the 440. And Wesley Clayton, feeling a strain in his leg on his first broad jump, immediately quit that event and skipped the 440 relay, which USC lost by the proverbial eye-

lash. However, his one leap was good for first place.

As anticipated, it was in the field that Bill Bowerman's team took its lumps. The Webfoots were blanked in the shot, discus and long jump, and gleaned only one point in the triple jump.

Fireworks failed to materialize as Archie San Romani of Oregon and Bruce Bess of USC clashed in the mile run. Bess held a 1-yd. lead after three laps, but San Romani then went full throttle to win by 30 yd. in 4:08.

With the meet already lost, Archie skipped the two-mile race in which he figured to double, but did gallop a leg in the concluding mile relay, which the Webfoots had the consolation of winning.

## Double Winners

Two performers did double. Theo Viltz of Troy took both hurdles events, while the great Harry Jerome of Oregon continued his amazing comeback following leg surgery to capture both sprints. Jerome equalled the 100-yd. meet mark of 9.5, then won the 220 in 21.2.

USC's Chris Johnson was mobbed by his teammates after edging Ray Van Asten in the 880 by clocking 1:52.6. Van Asten, making only his second competitive appearance of the season because of a siege with the flu, ran out of gas near the tape and slipped to second with 1:52.7.

## Delaney Stars

Actually, the star of the show was Bob Delaney of Santa Ana College, which won over the USC frosh, 88-59. Delaney not only bested all the USC and Oregon varsity runners in the combined 2-mile race but set a national JC record of 8:57.4. The old mark was 9:04.9, by Dick Krenzer, running for L.A. Valley in last year's state meet in Modesto.

A special high-jumping competition was won by John Rambo of Cal State (L.B.) at 6-10. Charlie Dumas of the Striders, first seven-footer in track history who now is attempting a comeback, had to settle for 6-8 after recently doing 7-0 3/8.

Another CSLB star, hammer thrower George Frenn, won a second special event with a 192-9 1/2 mark, tops among the nation's collegians this year.
